 at 8 single Reefs top sails through the night moderate breeze from the NE
 Latter part strong breeze & thick foggy with steering SW by S saw grate quantities of kelp
 No obs Lat $43-33$ Long $DR 54-41 W$

 Begins with fine Breeze from NE to N and thick foggy steering SW under single Reef
 top sails at 10 P.M. Close Reefs top sails at 11 Bled a gail tack in fore & main top sails & fore sail and lay by under 3 stay sails
