 S. E. Ward at 3 A. M.
 Light breeze from the Ward
 at 7 A. M. strong breeze from the
 same steering S. W.
 Saw a brig standing in shore
 at 11 A. M. made starboard
 Bearing S. E.
 Lat obs 54° 25' S

Friday
 The 24
 Begins with strong gales
 from the W. Ward
 Carrying sail heavy to
 fetch the mouth of the straits
 of Lemaire
 at 6 P. M. Passed them
 with the Brig in company
 middle part Calm
 latter part strong gales from
 the W. S. W. Steering by the
 Wind to the S. Ward
 under Close Reefed top sails
 Lat obs 55° 32' S
 Long 65° 50' W
