Stay Sails heavy bad Lee
Ship labouring heavy
Latter part, light airs from
W S W and heavy Lee from
S W Lat 58-22 S
Long D R 73-30 W

Begins with light airs from
W S W Employed in Repairing
and Splicing Rigging and Packing
at 4 P M bore ship to the S W hard
Through the night light airs
from S W at 8 A M bore ship
to the S hard Lat 58-42 S
