 Wind at N, so ends the day
 under Double Reefed
 top Sails jib and spanker
 Lat D R 56 8 S unobserved
 thick weather with light Rain
 Long D R 76 39 W

Monday The 10th
 108 put Begins with strong gales
 from the S.W. by W, S.W.
 which brought us under
 Close Reefed Top Sails
 jib, spanker, and main sail in
 heavy bad sea from all quarters
 middle and latter part heavy
 squalls of hail & Rain
 Wind N.W. by W. Lat N 54 30 S
 Long D R 77 12
