Thursday The 15 th	through the day Nothing Remarkable Wind S E 173 ^{out} through the Night by Lat obs 4-16 S Long by Wack at 10 AM 104 34 W
Friday The 16 th	Begins with fine weather Wind S E steering S W at 3 AM 174 ^{out} latter part by the Wind to the S at 4 PM saw a sail to Leeward Lat obs 4-33 S
Saturday The 17 th	through the day fine weather at 3 PM spoke the Ship Perseverance of London 175 ^{out} 18 months out 21 hundred went on board and spent the afternoon latter part steering to the Sward

Sunday The 18 th	January D 1829 through the day fine weather and Wind Several Ships in 176 ^{out} sight Lat obs 5-16 S
Monday The 19 th	through the day fine weather and pleasant breeze at 11 AM spoke the Ship 177 ^{out} Lydia of N York 158 2 months out 1000 barrels saw a fin back Whal Lat obs 5-34 S
Tuesday The 20 th	Begins with strong breeze from the S E steering to the E S E 178 ^{out} saw two fin and fin back at 7 AM saw sperm Whal's going fast to Windward could not get any
Wednesday The 21 st	Begins with pleasant weather Wind E S E steering by the Wind to the N E at 6 AM took to the S by W at 9 saw a sperm 179 ^{out} Whal but lost sight of her employed in repairing the Main Boal Lat 4 46
