of London spoke me Captⁿ W.
Porter 16 months out 1800
I went on board of him

Lat 33° 30' S

Wednesday
The 4th
192 out

Begins with squally weather
Standing to the N.E., wind
Employed in survey jobs
at 9 A.M. saw 3 Whales to the
land 2 boats with our
scurvy latter part
Employed in Chasing them
with the ship
Lat 32° 52'

Thursday
The 5th

February 1829

193^d

Begins with fine weather
Employed in Chasing the
Whales with the ship
through the S. Right Stand^{ing}
to the S., wind
at 5 A.M. took to the
S., wind Lat 33° 25' S

Friday
The 6th

Begins with strong breeze
under single reefed top sails
steering to the N. wind
Lat 31° 54' S

194^d

Saturday
The 7th
195^d

First fine weather steering to
the N.E. at 7 took to the
S.W. middle part light
showers of rain
latter part pleasant breeze
and cloudy standing to the S.W.
Lat 31° 10' S Long 107° 3'

Sunday
The 8th
196^d out

through the day standing to the
S., wind pleasant weather and
light breeze
Lat 31° 13' S
Long 108° 13'
