The 5th
22nd
Begins with fine weather
and light breeze from the
West, wind through the night
breeze fine breeze from
SW and light showers of rain
Standing to the S, wind
Lat 08 44 miles S

Friday
The 6th
22nd
Begins with pleasant breeze from
SW steering to the S, wind
Employed in Sunday jobs
No mails yet
Larger part, showing sea & clouds
Lat 08 36 miles S

Saturday
The 7th
22nd
Begins with light air from
the SW and Calms
middle and latter do
Lat 08 15 miles S

Sunday
The 8th
22nd
March 1829
Begins with light air and Calms
heading to the S, wind
Latter part pleasant breeze and
at 10 AM, taken to the S
Lat 08 12 miles S Long 131 53 W

Monday
The 9th
22nd
Begins with fine weather and
breeze from the S, wind
Standing to the S, with all sail
at 4 PM took in top of sails and
flying gill through the night
Sailing remarkable
Lat 08 16 miles S
Long 08 02 131 39 W

Tuesday
The 10th
22nd
Begins with fine weather and
pleasant breeze from S, wind
Standing to the S, wind
on board the main top sail
to repair at 3 PM and
Sperm Whales landed and killed
and took them to the ship
Long 08 19 39 W
Sun 8 AM
Through the night lay by the
Mails at 8 AM sent them
and wave sail to the S
Lat 08 33 miles S
