April, D 1829
Begins with fine weather and
pleasant breeze from the S.E.
Employed in traidding on shore
William Butts Did not return
on board but stayed on shore
Contrary to my Express orders

Sat 4th
25th out

through the day Employed in
Traidding on shore & taking of
vegetables half of the crew on
shore on Liberty

Sunday
the 5th
25th out

through the day fine weather
one Boats crew on shore on Liberty

Monday
the 6th

25th out
all this day Employed in
taking of vegetables
the ship struck a drift
but by letting go the other
anchors she brought up

Tues, the
7th
25th

at 9 A.M. having got
a sufficient recruit of vegetables
got under way for Wahoo
as the People is not yet all
well of Leam

Wednesd
the 8th
25th

April D 1829
Begins with strong breeze and
light showers of Rain
at 3 P.M. made the Isle of
Wahoo at 8 P.M. came to
anchor with small Bore in
at Patkams Water

Thurs 9

25th out

Begins with strong blasts of
Wind of the Land
Employed in setting up Rigging
middle part equally
at Day Light hoisted up the anchor
and dropped down & secured the
mouth of the Iron hank
anchors in D. Patkams Water
one third of the crew on shore
on Liberty. &c. Ends the day
