 The 1st Begins with thick foggy
 weather through the night
 Lay by head to the SSB
 Day ends with strong breeze from
 SW Lat obs 33-15 N
 Long obs 147-29 W

Monday Begins with strong gale from
 the S. S. W. Standing to the S. S. E.
 at 12 mid night wore ship to the
 W. S. W. at day light the
 crew of the fore sail parted
 on bent it to repair
 Lat obs 33 3 N

Tuesday Through the day thick foggy
 weather Wind at SW
 316 out Employed in rolling yards &c.
 Lat obs

Wednesday Begins with the thick foggy
 weather at 2 P. M. send a ship to
 Leeward Standing to the S. S. W.
 topped and stood to the S. S. W. &
 through the night Calm
 Day End with foggy weather

Thursday June 1829
 The 1st Begins with thick foggy weather
 318 out send a ship to Leeward
 X at 11 A. M. send a large mail
 going fast to Windward
 send a ship to Windward
 standing down towards me
 Day End in Lat obs 33-50 N

Friday at 10 P. M. send sperm whails
 The 1st Landed all the boats
 319 out But the fog and other causes
 X Combined rendered us from getting
 at 5 P. M. Returned on board
 and stood to the W. S. W. by the
 wind, thick foggy weather
 Day End with a gale from
 SW Lay by under main top sail

Saturday Begins with a gale from SW
 130 Laying too under main top sail
 320 out Head to the S. S. E.
 Day End with moderate breeze
 from S. S. E. send a ship to
 Windward Cutting in
 Lat obs 34 12 N
