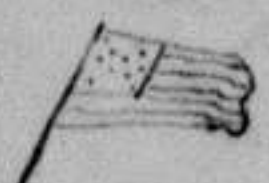


Barke On Board Bark Roscoe

Tuesday December 22nd 1846

Commences with light increasing breezes from NW
steered NW by W. Reversed & bent W. Tail Middle Strong
headed to Westward later Strong & some slightly steered
to SW. #11 Macked to North Saw 2 Ships to windward
Latitude 39° 30' Long. #16, 19 42 #4 19 27



Wednesday 23rd

Januar 18 57

All these 24 hours Strong breezes from NW to SW
by the wind to Northward under Double & Single reefs
#5 spoke Ship Calumet Stonington Skinner
75 Days from home Clean #7 Steered EBS under
Double reefs later fresh breezes from SW. Let Studding sails
#6 & #8 Hoist & sent up main Royal yard Course EBS

Latitude 39° 11' Long Merid Clock 17° 14'

Long # 430 P.M. Clock 16 33 30

Thursday 24th Januar 16 30 or

First part fresh breezes from NW flying Clouds
Middle & later Moderate with a high swell from SW
under all sail sent up 2. Mainmast Course EBS

Latitude Obs 39° 7' Long At Noon 14° 6' W

Friday 25th

First part Moderate breezes from West to NW fine
weather Steered EBS #6 Altered Course to East & let Studdings
on Starb Side the wind halled gradually to Northward
middle lively breezes #10 Steered EBS #5 30 A.M. raised
kite whales #6 lowered galled & chased a long time
in diff. directions the whales would not go off weather
would they let a Boat come near enough to strike
#9 fell in with 4 whales to leeward the boat had not
been troubled struck & by some means the line parted
#10 returned to ship it blowing on Strong from NW
& commenced storming Double reefed Saw 8 or 10 whales

Saturday 26th

12° 35'

Commences with Strong increasing gales from NW rainy
#2 P.M. took in sail headed to SW #6 30 was ship to
EBS Middle Strong gales took in Tarsail #1 was ship
to West #3 30 Wind West #6 A.M. was ship & steered North
let Double reefs Steered on Diff. Courses Ends more Moderate
& fair Wind NW but not a whale to be seen

Latitude Obs 39° 11' Long Noon 12° 25'

South Atlantic Ocean Toward the Indian Ocean

Sunday December 27th 1846

First part Strong breezes from NW hazy Smokey
on a wind to NW Saw fin backs #3 kept off EBS
as a course let all sail Studding sails #6 & #8
middle wind halled to SW thick & drizzly later clear
& fine weather Course SE under all sail no whales
Latitude Obs 39° 30' Long At Merid 9° 45'

Monday 28th

Commences Calm at 5 P.M. a light breeze from
NE clear weather #9 A.M. lively breeze from NW
cloudy Studding sails let Course EBS #5 A.M. Wind EBS
thick & rainy #7 wind halled to NW with a heavy
breeze let Studding #6 & #8 Hoist Ends with a lively
breeze from NW fine weather Lat 39 46

Long Count 7 30



Tuesday 29th

First part Moderate breezes from NW fine
& fine #2 30 Saw a kite whale toward Starb side & took
Along Side #6 got all ready for capturing later fresh gales
from SW & very rough cutting All hands employed cutting
but slow work Lat 39 35 Long At Merid 6 18 30

Wednesday 30th

First part Moderate but a heavy bad swell on for cutting
Saw 3 kite whales lowered 2 Boats did not succeed in
framing the whales were going fast to NW & a great many
Porpoises amongst with them #11 P.M. fine cutting cutting
& succeeded in framing all of them middle small breezes #12
started the work later Moderate breezes & fine from NW
lowered for 1 whale going fast to NW Saw several others
to windward Exp. Boiling Lat 39 36 Long 7 06

Thursday 31st

All these 24 hours fine Moderate weather wind from
NW to North first part Saw 2 whales going fast to NW
lowered but could not come up with them later
Saw nothing spoke Eng Ship } 72 Days from
London for Bombay got Papers Ends fine heading
to NE by the wind
