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First Part fine Breezes from SE fine Clear weather
Steered By the wind to ESE All hands Employed
Clearing away anchors Head At 2 the works well
under way At 6 tacked Ship to S.W. under all Sail
Middle took in light Sails later fresh & Clear
steered to ENE By the wind Saw nothing Sat 16th 10

First part lively breezes from SE fine weather
 altered to ESE by the wind #3 raised Sand Island
 bearing NEBE At Sunset Double reef tacked
 to SEW watch employed Bailing at 2 AM tacked to ESE
 Moderate later Strong under Double reefs at 9 raised
 Sand island bearing NEBE At Merid SE Dist 8
 miles #11 fine at all of the blubber

Monday 10th

First Part Moderate Breezes Come Equally Shared N.W.
At 1.30 halled up By the wind to S.W. At 4 P.m. at Bailing
Lat Leann Cleared the Hooks & C. Later lively Breezes from
S.E. Mostly Cloudy Shared N.E. at 10.30 A. A. Profound Calm
S.E. Observations Long about 54.15

All these 24 hours light Baffling breezes from ESE
to ESE with light squalls & showers later all hands
employed Stowing Down in After hold on Starb Side
Latitude Obs 15.58 Long. at 10 AM thro 54.10

fine whale weather Steered to Northward All hands
employed Stowing Down Oil Stowed Down
rising 70 blts Excluding 4 Cask had been previous

All these 24 hours Moderate Breezes from SE
to East fine Pleasant weather First 9 later
Stared to North Eastward and Suddled to Southward watch
Employed in Ships Duty Lat $16^{\circ} 35'$ Long $53^{\circ} 15'$
Have Experienced some West by current

Saturday 15th

All these 24 hours light Moderate weather first
part steered to NBE by the wind Middle on
Diff. Sacks later steered NNEBSE wind ESE
filled the Starboard Fore yard arm rigging to the
band & Put it on Blacksmith employed in
making Bands for the Topsail Hard arms Sat 11 00

Sunday 16th Long 11 2.30 P.M. 32 49

All these 24 hours light Pleasant weather
first part I stored myssr under all sail
later to 8 AM 38 Saw a Brig steering S W
Lat 16.15 Long 2 PM 32.00

Monday 17th

Monday 17th
All these 24 hours light Moderate weather. At
3 P.M. raised breeches to the G.W. hall up for
them but did see any thing of them again
later cleared & kiss. But nothing to be seen
watch employed in various gabs Sat 16.03

Tuesday 18th Long 142 37.19

First Port Moderate Breezes from SE fine weather
Steered West-Middle Small headed to NE under Short
Sail later hove from SE & some squally & showery
steered N by W. Watch employed in Ships Duty Oct 15 19
Saw Sulphur Bottoms

Wednesday 19th

Leaving At 10 AM 30" 55

Thursday 19th Long 11 46 Lat 33
All these 24 hours lively Breezes from SSE & fair N.E. P.M.
Raised the land near Cape East Steering inn N.W. N. 3.30
Tacked off Shoar About 3 miles Distance Steered off
all night with Double reefed F. I. Sail & whole Main I sail at
6.30 A.M. Tacked in the land in Light Sars & Firebacks watch
Employed in various jobs Lat 15.23 Long 11 40

Thursday 20th

Thursday 20
All these 24 hours fair weather at 3 PM tucked ship
of shore about 6 miles off Wind SSE hauled off shore
all night under double reef later turned NE & West
At 11 Showery the land in sight Saw Gulpher Bats & Whales
but no sperm Lat Obs 14 52 Long 3 PM L. Ho 50' 5"
