

Remarks On Board Bark Beaslee
Saturday July 24th 1847

All these 24 hours light moderate weather
Wind from SE to ESW At 1.30 P.M. returned on
Board finished stowing off & Wash Down
the Decks Later Emp Cleaning Bone

Sunday 25th
All these 24 hours Light Moderate Weather
Wind from South Eastward first Part Emp
in various gales. Sent No Boats off the Tibe
Boiling 4 miles to North

Monday 26th
All these 24 hours light Breezes from SE to
SW fine Pleasant weather At 7 A.M. got under
way for A Cruise Ends Near Calm

Tuesday 27th
First Part lively Breezes from SE At 5.30 Came
to Anchor in 10 fath. About one half way from
Chaluan Isl to Gofala River At 7 A.M. got under
way & steered along the Coast to Northward About
5 miles off At Merid Gofala Fort Bore N.W. Dist
8 miles with a small air from SW

Wednesday 28th
Commences with small airs from South Eastward
At 2 tacked to ESW At 5.30 Came to Anchor in 11 fath
13 miles to South of Gofala with a lively breeze
from East At 6.30 At 11 M. made all sail & took
my Anchor small breeze from North some fog
Anchored Main topsail to Mend Ends small breeze
from East At 7 sent 2 Boats off

Thursday 29th At 5.30 P.M. Came to Anchor in 15 fath 4 miles to East
of the Island Later sent 2 Boats off the Tibe 10 miles
to South & Anchor

Friday 30th
Commences with light Breezes from Eastward 2 Boats
off to Southward At 2 P.M. Mr. Doaker Struck A Whale
4 miles from the Ship turned up 3 miles At 3 took her
in to At 8 took her to the Ship Tacked her to starboard & away
she went got the Ship under way At 11 took her along
side & came to Anchor field sails &c. At 12 watched
later all hands Emp Cutting At 11.30 finished

At Gofala Bay for Hile Whales
Saturday 31st Friday July 30th 1847

First Part Small Breezes from South Eastward All
hands Emp Starting the Mills Cleaning the Decks &c
Middle Boiling Glad here matches later Small
Breezes from Westward sent 2 Boats off Cruising
the Tibe Anchored At 7 P.M. one mile to South from
the Southward later got under way on a Cruise to
Northward So Ends but No Whales to be seen

Sund August 1st
First Part Small Breezes from South Eastward
2 Boats off the rest Emp Boiling Middle fresh
Later sent 2 Boats off At 11 A.M. I lowered for it
A Whale 1/2 mile but side of the Ship At 1 P.M.
struck the Tibe 8 to 10 miles to North to Anchor

Monday 2nd
All these 24 hours light moderate weather from
first Part All Boats off 2 to South At 2.30 turned
the whale up 2 of the Tibe Boats Came took
him in to About 4 miles from my Ship At
Sunset-Less him with Mr. Coffin at 9
At the Tibe took him along side Ends
light airs from Westward 2 Boats off

Tuesday 3rd
All these 24 hours light moderate weather
first Part 2 Boats off At 4 P.M. finished Boiling
cleared the Decks later sent 2 Boats off
A Considerable fog during the fore noon At
11 Lowered for a whale He turned out to be
A Lump Back Chast him 3 miles below
Invariety Shoal with 2 of the Tibe Boats
but Could not fassen So Ends

Wednesday 4th

first Part Small Breezes from Eastward All
the Boats off At 1 P.M. Capt. Dickens Struck
A Whale turned him up 5 miles from my Ship
At 5 P.M. got under way At 8 took him along
side Later strong Breezes from S.W. to E.S.E. with
A Sharp choppy sea on All hands Emp Cutting At 12 finished
