Remarks On Board Bark Roscoe

Saturday August 14th

First Part Strong Breezes from South At 5 P.M. Tacked Ship off shore under Gingscreeps At 3³⁰ P.M. Tacked Ship to N.W. Tenter Moderate & fine under M. Sail At 7 raised the life 1st Part off Weather Bow At 10 went on Board for A Freedom Anchor & kept off to S.W. for My Anchor

Sunday 15th

All these 24 hours Light Moderate weather wind from S.W. to S.W. At 2 P.M. raised the buoy to limit Didid A. graplin sent Mr. Booken to drag for the chain after A long time I succeeded in hooking it At 6 took the line to the ship but was soon loose from it Maid sail again & maid A. Short took & Hooped the buried anchor near the buoy in the morning run A Boat anchor over the chain & have in & hooked it have it up & took it to the windlip again After hoisting up about one half of the chain & took up the latter anchor Ends Bay fine North Point of the Island bearing 31^{1/2} of A mile from the Bank

Monday 16th

All these 24 hours Light Moderate weather Sea & Land breezes Later 2 Boats Employed Sweeping for the lost anchor Caught hold of something Supposed it to be the anchor but the rope slipped off

Tuesday 17th

All these 24 hours Light Moderate weather First & Later Employed in Draging for the anchor without success Calm Main Taps Fore J. Sail to Mend

Wednesday 18th

All these 24 hours light Moderate weather first Part Emp in mending F. J. Sail & weeping for the anchor Middle lively breezes from E.S.E. later small from S.W. took 200 fathoms of line & put waits on it & vided again for the anchor without success & gave it up At 10 got under way first & sent F. J. Sail

At 11 59 155 the Course later small airs from S.W. to W. & calm content Possail to Mend in the week of the Fore stay Ends calm the Libey in sight to N.W. Latitude Obs 20⁵⁷ Long At 5 P.M. 35 33
Rate I. Add 50 miles

Friday 20th

All these 24 hours light breezes from East to S.W. stored by the wind to Southward first Part first & sent the Possail later rather early Main riging got up 2 heads of Bone to Day & Bone took off 45 fathoms of the poorest of the Lead & took off 35 the best of the Starboard & put on which makes hoath of the chains an equal length of 80 fathoms each the Lead is the best chain Ends with A small Broom W.R. the Land 8 miles off Lat 22 14

Saturday 21st

All these 24 hours light breezes from South to S.E. fine pleasant weather own diff tacks the Land from 5 to 25 miles off with Emp in various gabs trying & Bunking Bone &c Latitude 22 4 1/2

Sunday 22nd

Commences with small breezes from S.E. Middle from S.E. to S.W. Later Moderate from East to S.W. Course S.E. first Part first & Bunkling the Bone which makes 47 Bundles in all Latitude Obs 23 51 Long At Mend 37 18

Monday 23rd

All these 24 hours Moderate breezes from S.W. to S.E. fine clear weather stored E.S.E. & S.W. by the wind Saw finbacks killers &c Latitude 24 31 Long At 3 38 1/2

Tuesday 24th

All these 24 hours light Moderate weather Wind from S.W. to East clear & pleasant by the wind to South Eastward later content M. Sail to Mend if being near Calm Latitude Obs 25 08 Long At 11 39 1/2
