Tuesday December 19th 1848

All these 24 hours fine trades & fine weather
Course NW with all sail set watch Emp
Painting Lat Obs 4.44 Long Merid 24.40

Wednesday 20th

All these 24 hours lively trades from SE to SWS
fine weather Course NW Lat 3.41 S Long 27.00

Thursday 21st Friday 22nd

All these 24 hours fine trades & fine weather
watch Emp Painting ship painted the yards to the
main Latitude Obs 2.34 S Long Merid 29.34 West

Friday 22nd

All these 24 hours fresh trades from SE flying
clouds Course NWWS with all drawing sail set
watch Emp in painting & various other gabs
Lat Obs 1.15 S Long Merid 31.14

Saturday 23rd

All these 24 hours fine weather the wind decreased
later light & vary hot Course NWWS watch Emp
in various gabs finished painting Lat Obs 00 14.11
Long At Merid 32.50

Sunday 24th

First part Moderate breezes from SE Middle
light later light from East to ESE Course NWWS
All sail set except Fore Royal & that is in on the
Account of the look out Lat Obs 1.17 N Long
Merid 34.12

Monday 25th

All these 24 hours light breezes from East fine
weather Steered NWWS with all drawing sail set
watch Emp in sundry gabs Lat Obs 3.20 N
Long Merid 35.26

Tuesday 26th

First & Middle of these 24 hours Baffling & unsteady
breezes from ESE to ESE & Squally the breeze was strong
in the Squalls but at a short duration later lively
& steady trades from ESE watch Emp mending old
Forsail Lat 3.31 Long Merid 36.40

Wednesday 27th

First Part lively trades from ESE fine weather
Middle strong & Squally from NE to NNE later
fresh & passing clouds Course NWWS
Lat Obs 5.16 Long At Merid 38.40

Reascoe From St Helena towards S. Bede

Thursday Dec 28th 1848

All these 24 hours strong NE trade winds middle
& later strong squalls with heavy showers had the
studingsails in general times during the night
ends with strong breezes & mostly cloudy till light
& good top sail field All studingsails loose & NWWS
Wind NNE Lat Obs 6.52 Long Merid 40.40

Friday 29th

All these 24 hours strong trade winds from NNE
to ESE flying clouds & studingsails set these 24 hours
later fore topgainsail field Course NWWS
Lat Obs 9.11 N Long At Merid 42.30 NW

Saturday 30th

All these 24 hours strong trades from NNE to ESE
flying clouds & smoky A fore topmast studingsails
set A Part of the time Lat Obs 11.14 Long At Merid 44.30
Course NWWS

Sunday 31st

All of these 24 hours strong trade winds from NE to ESE
some squally topmast studingsails set A Part of
the time Course NWWS Lat Obs 13.40 Long Merid 46.30

Monday January 1st 1849

All these 24 hours fresh trades from NNE to ESE some
squally At 6 PM Steered NWWS carried topmast & topgainsail
studingsails & main Royal A part of the time first Part
Saw A brig to windward on the wind to South & East
Lat Obs 14.57 Long Merid 48.45
To gave Wm Dickson his watch below & kept him up 1 week

Tuesday 2nd

First Part of these 24 hours lively breezes from ESE
flying clouds Middle Moderate Later light from East
to ESE All Drawing sail set Course NW to NWWS
Latitude Obs 16.21 Long At 3.40 PM Obs 50.55
By Lunar 50.26

Wednesday 3rd

All these 24 hours Moderate & baffling breezes from SE to ESE
Middle some light squalls later Emp Painting Starb Boat
& bending main Mast & various other gabs Lat Obs 17.17 N
Long At 3.30 PM By Chron 51.52
By Lunar 51.42

Thursday 4th

All these 24 hours light Moderate weather kind from
SE to East Course NWWS watch Emp in painting Boats
& various other gabs Lat Obs 18.44 Long Long Merid 53.6

Friday 5th

All these 24 hours fine clear weather light & Moderate
breezes from East to SE Course NWWS Lat 19.32
Long Noon 54.25
