at 8 AM took the steam boat down the river
and came to anchor below the pier at one
PM took along signal from the westward with
breeze and wind let go the best lower anchor
at 3 PM for weather here up one the barg anchor

Friday July the 2 at 5 AM here short main sail
at 7 AM discharged the pilot and stood out for sea
at 8 PM the clock Island SE point bore 40 1/2 S
Sixty miles from with stand my depth at 12 mid
strong breeze and fair weather let part under the

Saturday July the 3 1841 These 24 hours
Came with fresh breeze from the SW ship
under all sail. Sailing strong SE all hands
Employed on ships duty fitting boats for whale
whaling and so forth latter part light breeze and
pleasant Lat by obs 40 21 N Long 68 55 W

Sunday July the 4
These 24 hours came light breeze and variable ship
under all sail steering SE all hands Employed
on ships middle part the same latter light
breeze and pleasant so under Lat by obs 39 59 N

Monday July the 5 These 24 hours came with
light breeze from the Northward ship under all sail
saw several black fish and the boats crew
got into middle part light winds and pleasant
latter part continued the same Lat by obs 39 59

Tuesday July the 6
These 24 hours came with fine breeze and fair
weather ship under all sail steering SE all
hands Employed on ships duty middle and
latter part the same Lat by obs 40 18 N

Blank Easter Master 1841
Wednesday July the 7 1841 These 24 hours came
with fresh breeze from the South and fair weather
ship under all sail steering SE all hands
Employed on ships duty middle part fine
weather at 9 AM wind on bearing took in the
topgallin sails took the topsails at
10 AM took in the main sail latter part
strong wind Lat by obs 40 25 N Long 68 30 W

Thursday July the 8
These 24 hours came with fresh gales from
the South and bearing clouds ship under
double reef topsails heading SE all hands
Employed on vessels etc at 6 PM let over the
out the topsails and set the main topgallin
in sails middle part fine breeze and fair
weather at 2 AM wore ship to the South latter
part fine breeze and heavy let see on Lat by obs 40 22
Longitude 68 35 W

Friday July the 9 1841 These 24 hours came with
fresh gales from the South ship under all sail
at 10 PM wind evening took in the topgallin sails
at 11 PM took the topsails took in the
main sail and set at 11 30 took in the fore and
main topsails at 12 midnight about took the main
topsail at 10 AM took in the foremast and stood
up the mast boat at 11 heavy gale from the South
and squally at 12 midnight took in the fore sail
and bore sail heading SE and off SE
to under these 24 hours all obs this day
