 Remarks on board Friday July the 16. 1841
 These 24 hours came with a fine breeze from
 the South Ship under all sail by the wind
 heading East all hands employed on
 Ships Duty Except the Steward and one man
 like off Duty Middle Part fine breeze and
 fine weather at 5 AM Squally Suck in the
 Main Topgallant Sail at 6 AM set the Topgallant
 Sails and then S E Latter Part fine weather
 Lat by obs 42 24 9.8 Long 71 00 W

Remarks on board Saturday July the 17
 These 24 hours came with a fine breeze from
 the S W and fine weather Ship under all sail
 by the wind all hands employed on Ships
 Duty Middle Part fine breeze and fine weather
 Latter Part continued the same to end the
 24 hours Lat by obs 42 13.8 Long 71 00 W

Remarks on board Sunday July the 18
 These 24 hours came with a fine breeze from
 South and S W Ship under all sail by the
 wind all hands employed on Ships Duty
 Tided away fly gill stay and set the flying
 gill Middle Part light breeze from the S W and
 Pleasant at 8 AM saw a wreck to the leewardward
 to it it proved to be the remains of a ship burnt
 gut after iron boiler and fine pieces of timber Latter
 Part Pleasant Lat by obs 42 13.8 Long 71 30 W

Monday July the 19
 These 24 hours came with a ship breeze from the
 S W Ship under all sail steering S E Middle
 Part fine breeze at 6 AM set the lower stowing sail

Charles Estes Master 1841
 at 7 AM set the Main Trawl all hands em-
 ployed on Ships Duty making out between decks
 and the stowing of fish to ender 3000 this day

Tuesday July the 20. 1841
 These 24 hours came with a fine breeze from the
 Westward Ship under all sail all hands emp-
 loyed on Ships Duty Middle Part fine breeze
 at 6 AM shifted over the stowing sails Latter
 Part fine breeze and Pleasant weather to ender
 Lat by obs 40 35.8 Long 73 20 W

Wednesday July the 21
 These 24 hours came with a fine breeze from
 the S W Ship under all sail all hands
 employed on Ships Duty Middle Part fine
 breeze at 5 AM saw several sail Latter Part
 continued the same Lat by obs 39 31.8 Long 73 55 W

Thursday July the 22
 These 24 hours came with a fine breeze from the
 S E and fine weather Ship under all sail
 Macks employed on Ships Duty at one PM
 Maids & boys having E S E dist 10 miles at 6 PM
 Thomas bore S E by E dist 10 miles Middle Part
 light breeze Latter Part fine breeze and Pleasant S E
 Lat by obs 38 14.8

Friday July the 23. 1841
 These 24 hours came with a light breeze from the
 E S E and pleasant Ship under all sail by the
 wind was employed on Ships Duty at one PM
 saw fog at having E N E dist 15 miles at 6 PM
