Saturday August the 28

These 24 hours Come with light breeze from the South and fine weather Ship under all sail By the wind was employed on Ship's Duty at 4 P.M. saw black hills bore the Boat did not strike Middle Part light winds Latter Part the same Lat By obs 20° 35' South

Sunday August the 29

These 24 hours Come with a fine breeze from the South and fine weather Ship under all sail By the wind was employed on Ship's Duty Middle Part light breeze and fine weather Latter Part continued the same & ends

Lat By obs 15° 9' Long in 24° 56' West
Monday August the 30

These 24 hours Come with a fine breeze from the South Ship under all sail By the wind Middle Part fresh breeze Latter Part continued the same & ends Lat By obs 12° 33' South

Tuesday August the 31

These 24 hours Come with a fresh breeze from South and fine weather Ship under all sail By the wind was employed on Ship's Duty Ship heading S.W. by W Middle Part light breeze Latter Part strong trade and passing clouds & ends Lat By obs 11° 40' South
Longitude 25° 13' W

Wednesday September the 1st 1841

These 24 hours Come with strong trade from the S.E. Ship under all sail By the wind was employed on Ship's Duty Middle Part fresh breeze at 6 A.M. under the topsails Latter part fresh trade Lat By obs 6° 36' South

Thursday September the 2^d

These 24 hours Come with strong gales from the S.E. Ship under full sail weather Ship under full sail Topsails heading S.W. by W was employed on Ship's Duty Middle Part fresh gales and squally Latter Part continued the same Lat By obs 2° 35' S
Longitude 27° 44' W

Friday Sept the 3^d

These 24 hours Come with a heavy gale from the S.E. Ship under full sail Topsails heading S.W. by W on the wind at 6 P.M. heavy squalls and light breeze came away the fore of the fore topsail yard sunk in the gill Middle Part squally and in the main sail at 8 A.M. set the main sail gill Latter part strong gales & ends

Lat By obs 10° 26' S

Saturday September the 4th

These 24 hours Come with strong gales from the S.E. Ship under full sail Topsails on the wind to the S.W. was employed on Ship's Duty bent the storm trizes and for spencer Middle Part fresh trade Latter Part strong gales from the S.E. Lat By obs 12° 44' Longitude 27° 50' W

Sunday Sept the 5th

These 24 hours Come with strong gales from the S.E. and squally Ship under full sail Topsails heading S.W. by W was employed on Ship's Duty at 7 P.M. under the fore topsail Middle Part strong gale at 8 A.M. set the gill and main sail and spencer at 9 A.M. set the Main sail Latter Part moderate & ends Lat By obs 14° 54' S 30° 39' W
