These 24 hours come with calm and light breeze ship under all sail with crew ready on ships duty at 4 P.M. light breeze from the S.E. at 12 let the fore topmast stowing sail at 12 midnight let the lower stowing sail latter part fresh wind from the north and hazy weather latt by obs 33 1/2 x Longitude 164 1/2

Friday Sept the 24

These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze from the north and hazy weather ship under all sail stowing S.E. with crew employed on ships duty repairing sails Middle Part thick weather took in the lower stowing sail at 5 A.M. took in the fore topmast stowing sail at 9 A.M. wind shift to the S.W. let the stowing sails latter part thick hazy weather so ends latt by obs 33 1/2

Saturday Sept the 25

These 24 hours come with thick hazy with ship under all sail stowing S.E. at 1 P.M. took in the lower stowing sail saw one fish took whole Middle Part light breeze at 9 A.M. took in the fore topmast stowing sail and hoist up sharp latter part thick hazy weather so ends latt by obs 33 1/2 x Longitude 164 1/2

Sunday Sept the 26

These 24 hours come with thick hazy weather wind at the north ship under all sail by the wind with crew employed on ships duty Middle Part calm at 7 A.M. saw sail to the Eastward latter part light latt by obs

Monday Sept the 27

These 24 hours come with light breeze from the Eastward ship under all sail by the wind ship heading S.E. Middle Part light breeze and calm at 1 P.M. light breeze let the fore topmast stowing sail latter part fresh breeze and heavy so ends this way

Tuesday Sept the 28

These 24 hours come with fresh breeze from the E.S.E. and heavy ship stowing S.E. on the wind saw a porpoise at 4 P.M. light breeze and heavy Middle Part fine breeze let the stowing sails latter part strong gale from the west and squally latt by obs 33 1/2 x Longitude 165 1/2

Wednesday Sept the 29

These 24 hours come with a strong gale from the west and squally at one P.M. took in the lower stowing sail at 2 P.M. took in the fore topmast stowing sail and fore main topgallant sail at 4 P.M. took in the fore main topgallant sail at 7 P.M. took in the fore topmast stowing sail at 11 P.M. took in the fore topmast Middle Part heavy gale from the westward at 9 A.M. hoist the fore main topgallant sail latter part heavy gale and squally latt by obs 33 1/2 x Longitude 166 1/2

Thursday Sept the 30

These 24 hours come with a heavy gale from the westward ship heading under close reefed fore main topgallant and fore main topmast staysail at 8 P.M. let the fore main topgallant sail at 4 P.M. let the fore main topmast staysail
