

Ship Howenow off Tule River 1844
Middle Part Calm at 10 AM light breeze from
the S.W. & East up the river set down the
main topgallant sail to repair latter part of
breeze Lat. by obs 36° 7' S Longitude 30° 44' East

Friday Oct the 8. These 24 hours come with a
light breeze from the S.W. and fair weather
at one PM went the main topgallant
sails ship string on the wind to the S.E.
all the work employed on ships duty
Middle part Irish breeze at one AM sent in the
topgallant sails at 8 AM double reef the topsails
Latter part strong gales and passing clouds
So ends Lat by obs 36° 7' S

Saturday Oct the 9
These 24 hours come with Irish gales from
the Eastward ship under double reef topsails
heading on the wind to the S.E. & S.W. which
employ on ships duty remaining sails Middle part
Irish gale latter part ends with strong gale
from the S.E. Lat by obs 37° 16' S Longitude 30° 44' East

Sunday Oct the 10
These 24 hours come with Irish gales from the
S.E. and clear weather ship under double reef
topsails heading S.E. & S.W. work employed on
ships duty Middle part fine breeze at 10 AM let
one reef out the topsails latter part Irish gales and
foggy weather Lat by obs 37° 31' South

Monday Oct the 11
These 24 hours come with Irish wind from the
S.E. and thick weather ship under single reef
topsails on the wind heading S.E. Middle part
Irish breeze at 7 AM let the main topgallant
sail Lat by obs 37° 11' S Longitude 30° 35' East

Clark Estes Master 1844
Tuesday Oct the 12

These 24 hours come with Irish breeze
from the South and hazy weather ship
under all sail by the wind work
employed on ships duty ship head S.E. &
Middle part Irish breeze at 10 AM sent
in the fore topgallant sail latter part
ends with thick weather Lat by obs 36° 59' Longitude 29°

Wednesday Oct the 13

These 24 hours come with Irish breeze from
the South and thick weather ship under all
sail by the wind work employed on ships
duty ship head S.E. at 4 PM squally at 9
PM wind sets to the westward let string sails
at 6 AM wind holds to the South which
string sails and hoist up on the wind
latter part thick weather so ends this day

Thursday Oct the 14

These 24 hours come with Irish gales from the
South and thick weather ship under double
reef topsails string on the wind to the Eastward
string in light at 10 PM let the reef out
the main topsail and let the main topgallant
sail latter part Irish breeze and passing clouds
Lat by obs 37° 16' S Longitude 30° 44' East

Friday Oct the 15 These 24 hours come with
light breeze from the Eastward and thick weather
ship under all sail by the wind work employed
on ships duty on one PM gale ship to the South
Middle and latter thick foggy weather so ends this day
