in sight at 4 PM took in sail for the
night at 6 AM set single Reef top-sails
at 8 AM saw whale land saw 3 boats
West boat struck and put stove lost 2
men and one shot of fire the whale
went of course on board took in the
stove boat wind increasing took
in sail latter part strong gale
from the westward and squally

December 1st These 24 hours commencing with strong
gales from the westward ship
lying low under coast Reef main
top-sail and fore sail at 2 PM
were ship to the North nothing in
sight Middle part were ship to the
South at 9 AM wind increasing took

Lat by obs 40° 00' in the fore sail at 11 AM saw 4 ships
Longitude 126° 45' to the Eastward

Thursday
December 2nd These 24 hours commencing with
strong gale from the Westward ship
lying low under coast Reef main
top-sails heading SE at 6 PM were
ship to the South Middle part Irish gale
at 5 AM set coast Reef top-sails at 11

AM showed the ship instead of 4
Lat by obs 41° 00' fore with 2700 of oil latter part hazy weather
all sail latter part hazy weather

Friday 3rd These 24 hours commencing with Irish breeze
from the Westward ship under all sail
whaling at 4 PM course 4 boats
and chased with out success at 5 PM
thick weather were ship to the North
at 7 PM shortened sail for the night
at 1 AM main all sail at 3 AM saw
whale land the boat landed boat struck
bow boat wild at 6 AM took in whale
to the ship and much hair at 9 AM land
4 boats struck saw whale with 4 boats
and chased latter part wind increasing

Lat by obs 46° 11' took in the fore top-sails
Longitude 126° 54' to course this day
