December 4



These 24 hours come with Irish gales from the W & to ship under all staying sail for whaling. At 8 PM saw whale land three boats barbed boat struck and cut and sunk at 6 PM. Saw with out success at 4 PM. Sunk in sail for the night. Middle part heavy wind at 4 PM. Set under Red Sails. Note this day with raising latter part continued the same.

Sunday
Dec the 5

These 24 hours commences with Irish gales from the S & W and raising ship under full sail. At 1 PM saw whale land three boats about with out success at 2 PM. Sunk in sail. Middle part light breeze at 4 PM. Under sail at 5 PM. Saw whale land and chased with out success at 9 PM. Sunk three boats.

Left by 10 AM and chased with out success latter part. Long in hope fine breeze and pleasant weather.

Monday
Dec the 6

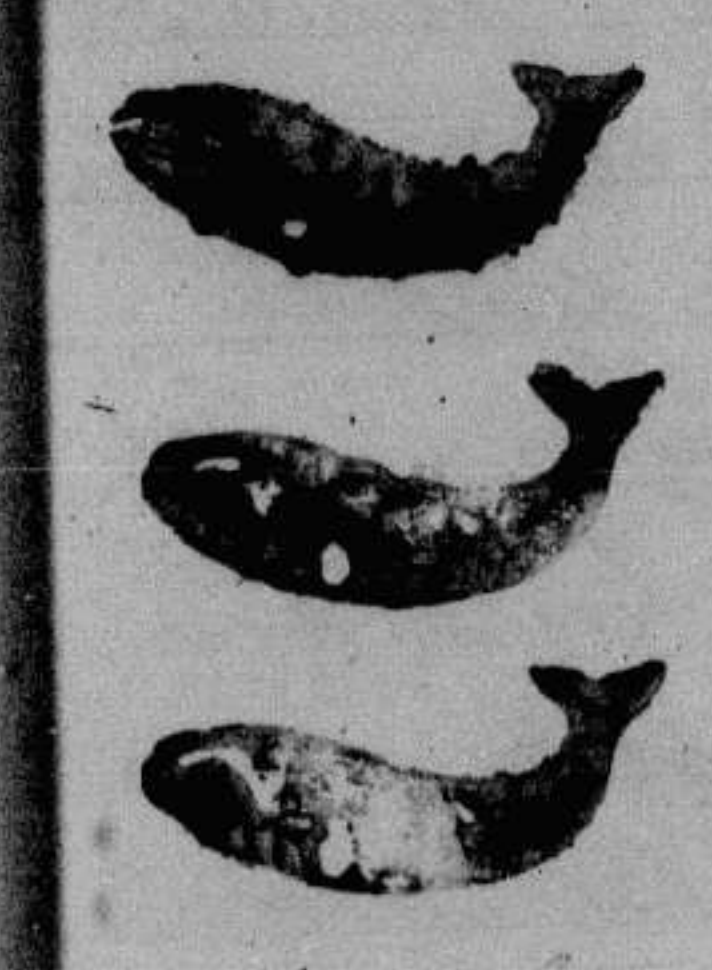


These 24 hours with slight breeze from the W & to ship under all sail by the wind all hands employed in whaling. At 6 PM saw 4 boats with boat struck and cut with iron at 7 PM. Sunk the whale in the ship and sunk in sail. Middle part pleasant weather at 4 PM.

Left by 10 AM. Began cutting at 9 AM. Finest made all sail. Latter part calm & sides.

Tuesday
Dec the 7



These 24 hours come with light breeze from the westward and hazy weather. Ship under all sail by the wind at 4 PM. Saw whale land three boats. Barbed boat struck and cut at 5 PM. Sunk the whale to the ship and sunk in head that and left at 9 PM. Began cutting at 5 PM. Began cutting at 9 PM. Sunk at 10 PM. Sunk 2 boats. Saw and a hard boat struck and cut at 12 noon. Sunk two whales to the ship & ended.

Wednesday
Dec the 8

These 24 hours come with fine breeze from the North at 1 PM. Began cutting at 4 PM. Finest cutting in fore. Whales sunk in sail and set back. Began middle part. Fair at 10 AM. Wind held to the S & at 4 PM. Saw a large ship to the westward. Latter part fine. Left by 10 AM. Breeze and pleasant weather all hands. Long in 12 PM. Employed on Baling.

Thursday
Dec the 9

These 24 hours come with light breeze from the North and pleasant weather. Ship being under close reefed main. Top sail and fore sail. Heading to the S & all hands employed Baling at 10 PM. Sunk the whale to the west & at 5 PM. Made sail at 6 AM. Began showing down saw several whales going fast to the westward. Saw sail in sight at 12 noon. Finest. Saw.

Left by 10 AM. Began cutting at 9 AM. Finest made all sail. Latter part calm & sides.
