 weather ship under all sail by
 the wind to the Eastward at 5 PM
 wind holing to the S.W. Squared the
 yards Middle part light breeze from
 the Westward at 4 PM Calm at 6 PM
 light breeze from the West to 7 PM
 Later part Ends light breeze and
 rising clouds
 Lat By obs 44° 39' N
 Long by 163° 55' E

Monday Jan the 31 These 24 hours came with light breeze
 and variable from the Westward and
 rising clouds ship under all sail
 steering E by N Middle part light breeze
 at 4 PM light breeze from the S.W. E am
 hazy weather later part continued the
 same so ends these 24 hours
 Lat By obs 45° 00' N
 Long by 164° 55' E

Tuesday February the 1 These 24 hours commenced with a
 light breeze from the S.W. E and
 hazy ship under all sail by the wind
 to the Eastward, each employed on
 ships duty at 7 PM stuck in sail
 fore the right and wore ship to the
 Westward Middle part light breeze
 wore ship to the E.S.E. at 4 PM main
 all sail stuck E.S.E. later part thick
 hazy weather so ends 24 hours
 No obs this day

on the Coast of New Zealand 1842
 Wednesday February the 2 These 24 hours came with light
 breeze from the S.W. E and thick
 hazy weather ship under all sail
 by the wind to the E.S.E. each
 employed on ships duty at 7 PM
 stuck in sail fore the right and
 wore ship to the Westward Middle part
 thick haze at 4 PM main all sail and
 stood East at 4 PM main the wind
 having E by S dist 20 miles it proved to
 be the right hand the South of New
 Zealand at 6 PM having stuck in the
 fish suble traced the shore later part
 Long by account the thick hazy weather so ends

Thursday Feb the 3 These 24 hours came with a fresh wind
 from the South and thick hazy weather
 ship under double headed topsails steering
 on the wind to the E.S.E. each square
 quantity of sail at 7 PM stuck in sail
 fore the right and wore ship to the East
 at 4 PM main sail and then E by S at
 6 PM main the second Island showing
 Lat By obs 45° 47' N S.E. dist 20 miles later part light breeze
 Long by 165° 40' E and variable so ends

Friday Feb the 4 These 24 hours came with slight
 breeze from the South and variable at 4
 PM hazy stuck in the main topgallant
 sail at 6 PM stuck in the main sail
 at 7 PM shortened sail fore the right and
 wore ship to the West at 10 PM having
 Lat By obs 46° 40' N E at 4 PM main sail stood S.W. E at 7
 Long by 171° 55' W by main New Zealand having so the dist
 20 miles later part hazy breeze so ends
