 Saturday Feb the 5 These 24 hours come with fresh wind
 from the S.W. and cloudy weather. Ship
 under all Sails at 3 P.M. saw one
 right whale going fast to the S.W. at 4
 P.M. double Tack the main topsails and
 took in the fore and mizen topsails and
 at 5 P.M. were ship to the south
 at 6 P.M. about 10 fathoms the main topsails
 took in the fore sail set the spritsail
 at 7 P.M. heavy gale from the S.W. in
 making ship head of south the land
 set in sight bearing S.E. 40 at 12
 Midnight took in the main topsails
 at 9 P.M. took in the fore boat later part
 heavy gale and squalls
 Lat By 46 52

Sunday Feb the 6 These 24 hours come with a heavy gale
 from the S.W. and squally ship lying
 under her three spritsails bearing of
 S.E. at 6 P.M. were ship to the west
 middle part fresh gale at 4 P.M. mizen
 at 5 P.M. made sail at 6 P.M. foggy
 later part light breeze and variable with
 Longine 172.00 E. hazy weather to Ende

Monday Feb the 7 These 24 hours come with light breeze
 from the westward and Calms ship
 under all sail. Sailing at 2 P.M. speak
 the ship Henry of South Harbor with
 her of 18 at 8 P.M. saw one whale
 head and chest with our success at 7
 Lat By 46 52 7 took in sail for the night at 4 am
 made sail later part light breeze

 S.E. 40 wind S.E. sailing in sight all
 the watch employed on ship duty
 at 7 P.M. took in sail for the night
 middle part fresh breeze from the north
 at 7 P.M. set the W.P. wind evening
 Lat By 46 52 10 later part fresh gale from the S.E.
 Longine 172.25 to Ende

Friday Feb the 11 These 24 hours come with a fresh gale
 from the S.E. ship under double top
 topsails at one P.M. at 2 P.M.
 wind evening took in the fore topsails
 at 3 P.M. about 10 fathoms the main topsails
 and here fore head E.P. saw one sail in sight
 Lat By 46 52 11 at 5 am made sail later part light breeze and
 Longine 172.29 variable to Ende
