

Ship *Thames* of *Falmer* 14th
 Saturday the 14th These 24 hours come with a light breeze
 from the S.E. to a cloudy weather
 ship under all sail by the wind
 to the North saw several fin backs and
 "blackbacks" at 7 P.M. such gill and main
 sail. Minor apparent sail. Entered the Port
 through the light at 8 P.M. made all
 sail it continued foggy later part
 Ends with light breeze and foggy

Sunday the 15th These 24 hours come with a light breeze
 from the North and thick foggy weather
 ship under all sail at 8 P.M. speak
 the *King* ship *Wilkes* of *St. John's*
 with 500 of whale oil at 6.30 P.M. then
 at 7 P.M. such in the gill and main sail
 at 8 P.M. made sail and then at 8.30 in
 company with the *Philias* of *Wilmington*
 later part thick foggy S.E. and hazy weather

Monday the 16th These 24 hours come with fresh breeze
 from the S.E. and hazy weather ship
 under all sail steering S.W. by W. sailing
 in sight at 7 P.M. such in sail
 Middle part light breeze at 2 A.M. were seen
 to the E. at 6 P.M. main sail and then
 at 8 P.M. later part light breeze saw three ships

Tuesday the 17th These 24 hours come with a light breeze
 from the South ship under all sail
 by the wind at one P.M. speak the ship
Barney of *Barbados* with 600 of oil Capt
Sal ship *Orion* of *Admiral* with 1000 of oil

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at 7 P.M. such in the main. Topgallant sail
 gill and main sail and then all right
 S.E. Middle part light breeze at 8 A.M.
 later part light breeze from the S.E. to Ende

Wednesday the 18th These 24 hours come with a light breeze from
 the S.E. and fair weather ship under all
 sail by the wind later part hazy weather
 at one P.M. went the chains and lead
 away the anchors at 4 P.M. entered the Bay
 of *Academ* at 6 P.M. came two anchors in
Academ Bay with the small *Boat* and
 with 30 fathoms of chain set and
 hauled the sails at 5 P.M. set the watch
 wind at North at 8 A.M. began gifting a
 Haft Tready to go on shore for water at
 at 9 A.M. such in the main and then the
 ship to the port the *Copper* later part
 light breeze from the North to Ende

Thursday the 19th These 24 hours come with a light breeze
 from the North and cloudy weather ship
 still lying in *Academ* Bay all hands
 employed on ships duty at 4 P.M. let
 part of the men go on shore *Blacksmith*
 the *Sec* *Pen* of *Duty* several days
 the ship *Jan* of *Thorn* got under way
 wind came in from the South came to
 anchor again Middle part light breeze from
 the South at 7 A.M. hazy gale and squally from
 the S.E. at one P.M. went go in shore for liberty
 later part Ende with hazy gale and
 squally so Ends these 24 hours
