Friday Feb the 18 These 24 hours Commenced with a heavy
gale from the South and squally the
lying around they are thought to be on
Liberty pick bait and Charles Porter at
Condie's place past heavy gale from the
South at 7 AM more moderate but one hour
after were present the Copper Tipped the
Ship at 10 AM wind held to the North
had the French Doctor on board to see the
Black Smith to London this day

Saturday Feb the 19 These 24 hours Commenced with a light breeze
from the North and fine weather all
hands employed working and watering
giving ready for sea left boats and the main
mast to down Middle part left Breeze from
the North at 6 AM got under way and
went to sea at 8 AM on board the Chame
put them below board the anchors
the Ship China in Company at 10 AM
Left by 11 AM the Ship's later part fresh
gales to London

Sunday Feb the 20 These 24 hours Commenced with a fresh gale
from the North and hazy weather Ship
under full best top sails by the wind
to the Eastward were employed on ship
only at 7 PM took in sail for the
Night Middle part Calm at 5 AM
Made sail and stood SE in Company
with the Ship China of New Bedford
later part fresh Breeze from the SE
one sail in sight ahead
to London

Monday Feb the 21 These 24 hours Commenced with a fresh breeze from
the SE & W Ship under all sail standing
SE at 4 PM Spent the Ship Superior
of 500 London with 1000 of oil at 7
PM took in sail for the Night head
to the South at 4 AM Made sail and
stood to the Eastward Left Night fish wind
No fish this day and finished with light breeze from the Ship
in sight to London

Tuesday Feb the 22 These 24 hours Commenced with light winds
from the NW and fine weather Ship under
all sail by the wind to the South
saw several fine Boats at 5 PM saw
three Night whale boats the Thistles and
Cham with out success at 7 PM
took in sail head to the Westward
at 11 midnight were Ship to the
Eastward at 5 AM set double Reef
top sails at 9 AM wind evening took
them in again eight Ships in sight
at 10 AM made sail again at 11 AM
took in sail and were Ship to the
Longitude 14.55 Eastward later part strong gales from
the South

Wednesday Feb the 23 These 24 hours Commenced with a fresh gale
from the South and squally weather
Ship lying to under close reef main
top sail and fore sail heading to the SE & E
Middle part fresh gales at 5 AM set fore
mast and main top sails and head to the
Westward at 9 AM were Ship to the SE
No fish this day at 10 AM set the main sail 5 Ships in
sight later part fresh gales and squally
to London
