

Ship Howenow of Fall River 1842
Thursday These 24 hours came with light
Feb the 24 Gale from the South and thick haze
Weather Ship under full Sail
at 2 PM saw one whale head & flukes
and chased with out success at 5 PM
Went Ship to the Westward at 6 PM
Suck in sail fore the sighted two
ships in sight Middle part Irish
Latt By 15.50 Gale at 7 PM Set full Sail
Long in 17.55 Later part Calm with Irish gales and
thick hazy weather

Friday
Feb the 25 These 24 hours came with Irish gales
from the South and squally ship under
full Sail having to the West
at 6 PM went Ship to the East and
Suck in sail fore the sighted three ships
in sight Middle part movement were ship
to the SW at 8 PM made sail 5 ships in
sight at 10 PM on board the main topsail

Latt By 15.50 sail and went weather later part fine
Long in 17.57 breeze and cloudy weather to end

Saturday These 24 hours came with a light breeze
Feb the 26 from the S.E. and cloudy weather ship
under all sail by the wind to the S.W.
at one PM on board the Mizzen topsail
and went across one all the work emp-
loyed on ship duty at 4 PM Suck in the
Main sail full Sail the topsails and
conced them through the sight at
4 PM made sail at 9 AM were ship

Latt By 15.50 to the Eastward later part calm and
foggy ends the thick weather

on Keppelano 1842
Sunday These 24 hours came with light
Feb the 27 was from the westward and calm
and foggy ship under all sail by
the wind to the South all the work
employed in repairing the fore topsail
at 4 PM on board the fore topsail and
went the other at 7 PM full Sail
the topsails and carried them through the
sight at 4 PM made all sail and then
S.E. at 9 AM saw one light whale
head fore theater barbed boat struck and

Latt 15.50 sail at 12 noon on board the whale to
Long in 17.55 the ship

Monday These 24 hours came with light breeze
Feb the 28 from the S.E. all hands employed
in cutting at 3 PM finished cutting in
set the gill and fore topsail and were
ship saw one whale head fore theater
boat struck barbed boat with
at 6 PM Suck the whale to the ship
and began cutting gut head throat and
legs and cast down fore the sight
set the work fore Boiling Middle part
Calve at 5 PM began cutting at 10 PM
finished and made sail saw several
whale heads chased with out success

Latt By 15.50 later part light breeze from the west

Tuesday These 24 hours came with light breeze
March the 1 from the west and light squally and
foggy ship under all sail at 3 PM on board
with out success 12 ships in sight

Latt By 15.50 at 12 midnight were sail to the S.E. at 1 PM
Long in 17.50 set the full Sail fore topsail at set the
Squall the Mizzen topsail and set to end
