 Wednesday These 24 hours came with a brisk
 March 3 Gale from the W & W and clearing
 weather ship under all. 4 PM saw
 two whales all the week employed
 on hugging at 8 PM saw one whale
 board son boat chased with out success
 saw sail in sight at 12 midnight were
 Lat by obs 45.50 Ship at 5 AM began showing down later
 Long in 17.55 Part Irish gale from the W & W to Endeavour

Thursday
 March the 4 These 24 hours came with a brisk gale
 from the W & W and clearing the sea all hands
 employed in showing down at 2 PM
 set double the topsails at 6 PM finished
 showing of canvas sail through the rig
 Middle part light breeze at 8 AM saw
 all sail at 1 PM saw whale board son
 boat saw boat struck and died later
 Lat by obs 45.53 Part light breeze and variable to Endeavour
 Long in 17.50

Friday
 March the 5 These 24 hours came with light breeze
 from the westward ship under all sail
 at 3 PM saw two whales and chased
 with out success at 6 PM saw boat
 struck and died and board the whale
 went up at 7 PM huck in sail for the
 rig at 8 AM made all sail at 8
 AM saw whale board son boat at 10
 AM saw boat struck and died
 at 11 AM turned the whale up at
 at 12 Meridian huck the whale to
 the ship to Endeavour with light breeze

Lat by obs 45.56 From the westward
 Long in 17.47

 March 5 from the westward at one PM began
 cutting in at 4 PM finished cutting
 8 ships in sight at 6 PM huck in
 the main topsail and set the
 reach Working Middle part light breeze
 at 8 AM wind increasing from the
 W & W at 6 PM saw whale board
 son boat and chased with out
 Lat by obs 45.50 Success at 9 AM huck the
 Long in 17.52 topsails later part Irish gale to Endeavour

Sunday
 March the 6 These 24 hours came with Irish gale
 from the S & W and hazy weather
 ship under double the topsails at one
 PM were ship to the S & E one sail in
 sight at 6 PM huck in sail all hands
 employed on hugging at 9 PM huck
 at 10 PM Irish wind from the south
 at 11 PM huck in the fore sail and
 huck the main topsail at 12
 Midnight were ship to the W & W and
 could come at 2 AM huck in the main
 Lat by obs 45.56 topsail at 4 AM hazy gale from the
 Long in 17.50 South later part clear with hazy gales

Monday
 March the 7 These 24 hours came with strong gales
 from the South ship lying low under
 the Mizzen and main shrou and least
 the main topsail at one PM began
 hugging at 4 PM finished were ship to
 the S & E Middle part hazy gale at 8 AM
 huck in the fore sail at 9 PM huck in
 the main topsail were ship to the S & E
 to Endeavour
