 began cutting at 9 P.M. finished cutting
 11 in sail and set the wash Middle
 Part Hoisting at 4 A.M. did Hoist the
 Main Tapsail at 7 A.M. about 10 P.M. the
 fore sail at 9 A.M. took in the fore sail
 and Main Tapsail set the Spruce later

 lying under the Spruce heading S.W.
 at 5 P.M. took in the bow boat Middle
 Part heavy gale at 6 A.M. more moderate
 at 10 A.M. put the boat on the crane set
 the fore sail close Hoist Main Tapsail and
 began Hoisting saw one sail to the North
 these ship to the S.E. later part more

 Tuesday
 March the 29 These 24 hours come with brisk gale
 From the S.W. and fair weather ship
 under about Half Main Tapsail and fore
 sail heading to the S.E. all the wash emp-
 loyed in Hoisting and Cropping Boon 4 ships
 in sight at 11 P.M. wind held to the westward
 Head of S.E. to midnight and howled
 at 7 A.M. began Hoisting down at 10 A.M.
 Hoist Hoisting at 11 A.M. saw white
 head fore Tapsail and Chast with out since
 a later part light Breeze and heavy sea

Wednesday
 March the 30 These 24 hours come with slight Breeze
 From the S.W. at one P.M. set Double Top
 Tapsails all hands employed on Hoisting
 down 4 ships in sight at 6 P.M. took in
 sail fore the right Middle part first Breeze
 at 3 A.M. were ship to the fore at 6 A.M. made
 sail at 6 A.M. saw whale head fore Boat
 Starboard Boat struck and cut fore Boat
 struck and started at 11 A.M. came fore Boat
 Chast with out since later part strong breeze

Thursday
 March the 31 These 24 hours come with fresh wind
 From the S.W. and equally at one P.M.
 head fore Boats fore Boat struck and
 Starboard Boat Cried at 5 P.M. took the
 whale to the ship took in sail 6 ships
 in sight Middle part first gale at 10 A.M.
 began cutting gut the throat and lips
 and part of one Bladder fore Hoist kept
 out the whale went toward the bows

Left Hydr 4522 in waving ship parted the back house
 and lost the whale later part heavy gale
