 Thursday April the 7 These 24 hours come with Irish winds from the S.W. & ship under all sail by the wind all hands employed in knocking out between decks and several whale going fast at 6 PM took in sail fore the slight middle part Irish winds at 6 AM main sail down on the wind  
 Lat Bych 45.44 Long 17.12.50 whale in sight 7 ships in sight

Friday April the 8 These 24 hours come with Irish gale from the S.W. & fair weather ship under single reef topsails at one PM Jacked ship to the S.W. & ships in sight at 6 PM took in sail fore the slight middle part Irish winds at 6 AM main sail and fore ship to the Eastward at 9 AM were ship to the S.W. at 10 AM store  
 Lat Bych 45.38 Long 17.55 Irish gale from the S.W. & fair weather

Saturday April the 9 These 24 hours come with Irish gales from the S.W. & ship under single reef topsails running W.S.W. at 2 PM saw whale hole on the wind to the S.W. & took the topsails to the fore at 4 PM took in the fore and main topsails and gill at 6 PM Coast kept the main topsail at 6 PM took in sail and were ship to the Eastward at 12 midnight Hoisted the fore sail at 4 AM set double reef topsails one ship in sight to the westward at 10 AM were ship to the Eastward later part Irish gales  
 Lat Bych 45.35 Long 17.55 fair weather to Endeavour

Of *New Zealand, Clark, Ester, Master* 1842  
 Saturday April the 10 These 24 hours come with Irish gales from the S.W. & fair weather ship under single reef topsails on the wind to the Eastward at one PM were ship and steered W.S.W. nothing in sight at 6 PM were ship and took in sail middle part Irish gales at 6 AM set double reef topsails and were ship to the Eastward at 9 AM took in the fore topsail later part heavy gale

Sunday April the 11 These 24 hours come with a heavy gale from the S.W. & fair weather at one PM took in the fore sail and coast kept main topsail and were ship to the Eastward set the fore and main spinnies at 6 PM were ship to the westward middle part heavy gale at 7 AM were ship to the Eastward later part heavy gale to Endeavour

Monday April the 12 These 24 hours come with heavy gale from the S.W. & fair weather ship lying under the three spinnies one ship in sight at 5 PM were ship to the Westward middle part West. Steered at 6 AM set the Coast kept main topsail and fore sail at 7 AM were ship to the Eastward and set the double reef fore and main topsails at 10 PM were ship in sight later part Irish gales and thick weather to Endeavour
