 Wednesday April the 13
 The first part of these 24 hours be-
 gins with fresh gale from the
 North and thick weather ship under
 double reef topsails heading to the
 N.W. & N. Battering in sight at 6 P.M.
 Tuck in sail head to the Eastward Middle
 part heavy gale from the N.E. & S.E. & S.W.
 They sail at 7 A.M. were ship to the west-
 ward later part moderate to Endeavour

Thursday April the 14
 The first part of these 24 hours begin
 with fresh breeze from the S.W. & S.E.
 at one P.M. were ship to the westward
 and set double reef topsails ship
 head S.W. & N.W. saw several Finbacks whale
 at 5 P.M. saw a sail to the South at 6 P.M.
 Shorten sail and then under Closest reef
 Main topsail and fore sail through the
 light S.W. & S.E. at 6 P.M. set double reef
 fore and Mizzen topsail at 7 A.M. were
 head to the S.E. and heavy later part
 heavy gale from the S.E. and heavy to Endeavour

Friday April the 15
 These 24 hours come with heavy gale
 from the S.E. and heavy ship under
 double reef topsails steering S.E. at 3 P.M.
 Tuck in fore sail and fore topsail tuck the
 in the fore mast tierce up the mast boat
 tuck in the main topsail and fore topsail
 at 6 P.M. were heading to the South
 and heavy with heavy squalls
 later part heavy gale and thick
 weather to Endeavour

on the Coast of New Zealand 1842
 Saturday April the 16
 These 24 hours come with heavy gale
 from the S.W. and heavy squalls of
 Main ship lying and the fore topsail
 heading to the S.E. Middle part continue
 and the same later part Endeavour with
 heavy gale and squalls to Endeavour

Sunday April the 17
 These 24 hours come with heavy gale
 from the S.W. ship lying to the S.W.
 fore topsail and fore sail head to the
 S.E. Middle part continue the
 same at 4 P.M. were under at 5 P.M.
 set double reef topsails and then of
 S.W. & N.W. saw whale board fore
 quarter Hunter with out Cooch saw
 reef at 11 A.M. tuck in the fore and
 Mizzen topsail to Endeavour

Monday April the 18
 These 24 hours come with heavy gale
 from the S.W. and heavy ship lying
 fore under Closest reef Main topsail and
 fore sail and fore topsail at 6 P.M. were ship
 to the S.E. at 12 Midnight were ship
 to the S.W. at 6 A.M. were sail at 7 A.M.
 head to the S.E. later part fine breeze and
 rising clouds to Endeavour

Tuesday April the 19
 These 24 hours come with fine breeze
 from the Westward ship under all
 topsails steering S.W. & S.E. were the
 Chatham and Balance which employed
 on ship's duty at 12 Midnight were ship
 to the S.W. at 6 A.M. were all sail at 7 A.M.
 head to the S.W. the same turning S.E. & S.W. 25 miles
