 from the S.W. and cloudy weather
 All employed in getting of Potatoes at
 3 PM finished Shift three men that
 was Eastward in the Bay this last
 full discharge and man by the name of
 George at 4 PM shut out the Bay Stead
 at 6 PM shortened sail for the night
 Middle Port Thick weather at 7 PM set
 Lat By 4 PM 36 Double Reef Sperm whale
 Later part fresh Breeze and thick weather

Sunday
 May the 30 These 24 hours come with a fresh breeze
 from the S.W. and hazy weather Ship
 under Double Reef Sperm whale heading 40° N
 All the work employed on ships duty
 at 6 PM took in sail for the night
 Middle Port light breeze and thick weather
 at 7 PM set Double Reef Sperm whale
 the North and thick weather Later part
 Continued the same to End

Monday
 May the 31 These 24 hours come with slight breeze
 from the North and thick foggy
 weather Ship under Double Reef Sperm whale
 heading to the N.E. at 6 PM took in
 sail for the night and saw Sperm whale
 Middle Port light breeze at 6.30 PM
 Main sail saw Sperm whale heard
 three Boats barbed Boat struck Mast
 Boat Circle at 10 PM took the whale
 to the Ship and began cutting
 to 6 PM this day later part light Breeze and hazy
 weather to End

Charles Estes Master 1842
 Tuesday These 24 hours come with slight Breeze
 from the Westward and thick weather
 All hands employed in cutting at 6
 PM finished cutting took in sail and
 set the work Boiling Middle Port light
 Breeze and calm with thick weather
 at 6 PM main sail at 7 PM saw whale
 Lat By 4 PM 36 and Chaud with out compass later
 Longitude 179° 07' Part calm to End

Wednesday
 May the 1 These 24 hours come with light Breeze
 from the Eastward and calm ship
 under all sail Sperm whale by the wind
 all hands employed on working at
 5 PM took in sail for the night
 Middle Port calm at 4 PM slight breeze
 from the E.S.E. at 11 PM could hear
 Lat By 4 PM 36 Later part light Breeze and hazy weather
 Longitude 179° 00' set the main sail to End

Thursday
 May the 2 These 24 hours come with slight Breeze
 from the E.S.E. and hazy weather Ship
 under all sail by the wind to the S.E.
 all hands employed in clearing up the
 decks at 2 PM saw a sail to the East of
 us at 5 PM took in sail at 6 PM speak
 the ship wharves of the Thetford Brown
 home with 50.00 of oil Middle Port
 fresh breeze from the E.S.E. at 7 PM began
 Striving down oil at 8 PM were ship to
 the S.E. hold up the fore sail
 Later part Breeze increasing End
 With fresh breeze and cloudy weather
 Lat By 4 PM 36 Longitude 179° 10'
