Thursday May the 19 These 24 hours came with a heavy gale
From the north and equally
Ship lying low under 'Closest' Reef
Main Tapsail and Fore and Main
Spencer at 6 PM took in the Main
Tapsail Middle Part heavy gale later part
Long in 17 1/2 57 Continued the same to End

Friday May the 20 These 24 hours came with a heavy gale
From the south and equally weather
Ship lying under Fore and Main
Spencer at 2 PM set about Reef Main
Tapsail Middle Part Irish gale at 4 PM
Main Tapsail at 6 PM took in the Fore
Tapsail Middle Part set the Fore sail
and took the Main Tapsail at 9 PM
Let one Reef out the Fore and Main
Long in 17 1/2 58 Tapsail later part Irish gale and equally

Saturday May the 21 These 24 hours came with a fresh gale
From the south and S.W. and equally
Ship under all Sails at one PM let
one Reef out each Tapsail set the Main
Tapsail and set the Mizzen Tapsail
at 3 PM set the gill Middle Part
Irish breeze at 6 PM took all the Taps
at 7 PM set the Mizzen
Long in 17 1/2 59 set the Tapsails at 7 PM set the Main
Long in 17 1/2 55 Sail later part Irish breeze and passing close

Sunday May the 22 These 24 hours came with a fresh breeze
From the westward and passing clouds
Ship under all sail by the wind to the
South at 2 PM took the Mizzen Middle part
Long in 17 1/2 60 Later part Irish breeze to End

Thursday May the 23 These 24 hours came with a fresh
breeze From the W.S.W. and fair weather
Ship under all sail by the wind to
the South at 5 PM took the Main
Tapsail Middle Part Irish gale from
the westward at 7 PM took ship to
the South at 9 PM set about the
Tapsail at 10 PM took in the Mizzen
and Mizzen Tapsail all the week except
Long in 17 1/2 61 according the Main Spencer later part
May gale to End

Friday May the 24 These 24 hours came with a heavy gale
From the West Ship lying low under
Closest Reef Main Tapsail and Fore and
Main Spencer had 4 PM all the week
Employed on mending sails and other
Irish gale at 12 Midnight took aboard
at 6 PM took all sail about 8 PM
Wind at S.E. at 10 PM wind blew to the
S.W. at 11 PM later part Irish breeze and fair
Long in 17 1/2 62 weather to End

Saturday May the 25 These 24 hours came with a fine breeze
From the E.S.E. and fair weather Ship
under all sail by the wind to the South
all hands employed on Ship's Duty
Mending old sails on Tacking and
Mending old sails at 6 PM took in
Sail from the Right Middle part wind
blew to the South at 6 PM Main sail
Ship head to the Westward at 10 PM
Long in 17 1/2 63 Wind continuing with thick weather
later part Irish breeze with Irish gale
