weather. Ship under close Reef. Sailing
by the wind to the S.W. all the
watch Employed on Ship's Duty
at 5 P.M. Sunk in sail for the Night.
Middle Port light breeze from the N.W.
at 7 A.M. main sail set. Main Mast
at 9 A.M. saw black fish found for 20 to 21
Gut saw one in the bottom Boat and one
Long in 17.50 to the New Boat. Later part light breeze.

Monday
May the 30
These 24 hours came with slight
breeze from the S.W. and fair weather.
Ship under all sail. Sailing
at 5 P.M. Sunk in sail for the Night.
Middle Port light breeze at 6 A.M. main
sail on the wind to the S.W. all the
watch Employed on mending sails.
Later part fine breeze to 20 to 21

These 24 hours
came with strong breeze from the S.W.
and fair weather. Ship under all sail.
By the wind watch Employed
on mending sails at 10 P.M. saw
 sperm whales at 2 P.M. landed 12. Throat
Bow Boat struck at 5 P.M. struck
