

Ship Recovery of Patterson 1842
 Tues day June the 7 These 24 hours come with a light breeze from the SE and fair weather. Ship under light sail heading to the SE. All hands employed on stowing down Middle Port light Breeze at 6 AM Main sail and foremast showing down later part light breeze. Lat 34° 45' N Long 117° 45' W Saw Spinn whale board Rose Thores and Chast with out Capt to Enr

Wednesday June the 8 These 24 hours come with a light breeze from the South and fair weather. Ship under all sail by the wind all hands employed in thinking out and stowing down overhaling the provisions and heaving it over at 4 PM saw Spinn whale board three Thores chased with out Capt at 6 AM set in sail. Middle Port light Breeze at 6 AM set double Reef. Spsails later part Irish Breeze from the South and hazy weather to Enr.

Thursday June the 9 These 24 hours come with a light wind from the South and hazy weather at 2 PM on board and bent the fore sail all the work employed on ships duty at 5 PM set in sail. Fore the right and were ship to the SE. Middle Port Irish gale from the SE at 7 AM began mending sails later part hazy to Enr this day. Note this day.

 Friday June the 10 These 24 hours come with a heavy gale from the SE and hazy ship by in under close reef Main topsails and fore sail heading to the SE. All the work employed on mending sails Middle Port light breeze at 6 AM Main sail and foremast showing down later part light Breeze to Enr. Lat 34° 45' N Long 117° 45' W

Saturday June the 11 These 24 hours come with a light breeze from the South and hazy weather. Ship under all sail by the wind all hands employed on ships duty. Mending sails and other rigging at 5 PM set in sail for the right Middle Port light Breeze from the SE at 6 AM Main sail to the SE. Later part Enr with light breeze. Note this day.

Sunday June the 12 These 24 hours come with a light wind from the SE and hazy weather. Ship under all sail by the wind to the SE. All hands employed on ships duty at 5 PM set in sail. Fore the right Middle Port Irish gale from the South and hazy at 7 AM set double Reef topsails. Note Lat 34° 45' N Long 117° 45' W on the wind to the Eastward later part Enr with thick weather.

Monday June the 13 These 24 hours come with Irish gale from the South and thick weather. Ship under double Reef topsails steering to the SE.
