At 5 PM here saw with the heads
black Middle Port Irish breeze at 5
PM came away at day light saw the
land bearing North dist 30 miles

Lat 44° 25' N Long 157° 11' W
At 11 AM here a black of the island
Long in 157° 00' of the atoungalater part Irish breeze

Sunday
Sun the 26 These 24 hours came with a fresh
breeze from the S.E. at one PM
sent one boat on shore at 4 PM
Tuesday on board at 9 PM stood of
shore Middle Port Irish breeze at
6 AM Capt. Ester went on shore
with two boats to hunt the
ship at 8 AM the boats returned on
board with Pellets and Fruits and 30 fath
to ends

Monday
Sun the 27 These 24 hours came with fresh breeze
from the S.E. still lying of and on
at the island of Howatonga New
cutting the ship at 5 PM Capt. Ester
on board took up the boats and
stood of shore Middle Port Irish
breeze at 4 PM stood in shore at
6 AM Capt. Ester went on shore
New wood with two boats at 10 AM
Lat 44° 25' N Long 157° 11' W
One boat returned on board with
New Peck later part Irish breeze so ends

Tuesday
Sun the 28 These 24 hours came with fresh breeze
from the S.E. and fair weather at
Lat 44° 25' N Long 157° 11' W
one PM made sail and stood of S.E.
Long in 157° 29' Middle and later part Irish breeze

Wednesday
Sun the 29 These 24 hours came with fair
breeze from the S.E. and pleasant
weather ship under all sail by the
wind to the S.E. all the week
Employed on ships duty Matting
down rigging Middle part fresh
breeze at 4 AM wind incline to the
Long in 157° 40' North later part fresh breeze so ends

Thursday
Sun the 30 These 24 hours came with a fresh
breeze from the North ship under
all sail being S.W. and
Employed on ships duty and
Sofort at 2 PM took in the 4 and
Mizen Topgallant sail at 11 PM Dull
thick fog and main Topgallant and
Mizen Topgallant at 12 Midnight took
in the 4 and main sail at 3 PM
Irish gale and raining at 7 PM
No ob this day Mordat set all sail later part light
breeze and rainy so ends

Friday
July the 1 These 24 hours came with a light
breeze from the S.E. and fair
weather ship under all sail
Storing C.W. & Cooper Employed
on taking up stocks at 5 PM
took in the 4 and Mizen
Topgallant sail
Middle Part light breeze and
cloudy weather at 6 PM set the 4 and
Mizen Topgallant sail
Lat 44° 25' N Long 157° 29' W
later part light breeze from the
Long in 157° 45' South so ends
