 Thursday August the 18 These 24 hours began with
 a brisk breeze from the S E
 and sailing close ship under
 double reef topsails strong S.W. 10
 Wind employed on ship's duty
 At 6 P.M. took in sail for the
 right head S.W. 10 Middle part
 wind continued to the S.E. at 6 AM
 set double reef topsails at 6 P.M.
 took this day. Steer West later part continued
 sailing S. E. ends

Friday August the 19 These 24 hours began with a brisk
 breeze from the S.E. and thick
 hazy weather at one P.M.
 took in the fore and main
 topsails held up the fore sail
 head to the S.E. Middle part. Brisk
 gales at 7 AM were ship and steer
 W. 10 at 6 AM set the fore topsail
 single reef later part hazy S. E. ends

Saturday August the 20 These 24 hours began with a brisk gale
 from the North and hazy weather
 took in the fore topsail
 Middle part wind variable at 6
 AM. took in the fore sail and steer of
 Long in 1740 W. 10 at 6 AM later part hazy weather

Sunday August the 21 These 24 hours began with a brisk
 breeze from the S.E. and hazy
 weather at one P.M. on board the
 fore topsail and West another one
 at 6 P.M. took in sail for the right

Monday August the 22 These 24 hours began with a brisk

 weather ship under all sail
 Sailing strong W. 10 at 6 P.M.
 took in sail for the right
 and head to the Eastward at 6 AM
 hazy set double reef topsails at
 10 AM wind increasing took in
 the fore and main topsails and
 fore sail least kept the main
 topsail were ship to the Eastward
 later part heavy gale from the North

Tuesday August the 23 These 24 hours began with a brisk
 gale from the North and thick
 weather ship sailing under close
 reef main topsails and main spruce
 Middle part light breeze at 6 AM
 took all sail at 11 AM. took in
 the ship from of New London 17
 took this day. Master out with square sail
 later part light breeze S. E. ends

Wednesday August the 24 These 24 hours began with a light
 breeze from the South and pleasant
 ship under all sail heading to
 the westward with employed on
 ship's duty at 6 AM. took in sail
 Long in 1740 W. 10 at 6 AM later part thick breeze S. E. ends
