 Lat Byob 29° 44' Sd 70 Later part Irish breeze Long in 176° 40' and thick weather so ends

Thursday September 1st 1842 These 24 hours Comm. with a Irish breeze from the S.E. and thick weather Ship Steady to the S.W. all the work Employed on Ships duty at 6 P.M. Tuck in sail for the night Middle part Irish gale Tuck in the fore sail at 7 P.M. set double Reef Sails Stead
 Lat Byob 30° 30' Sd 70 Later part Ends Long in 177° 17' with Irish gales so ends

Friday Sept 2nd These 24 hours Comm. with Irish gale from the S.E. and cloudy weather Ship under double Reef Topsails at one P.M. made the Island having 8° 40' dist 40 miles one of the Curtis islands at 2 P.M. then for it at 6 P.M. Tuck in sail and were ship to the south the island bore 85° 40' dist 16 miles at one A.M. When ship Stead in at 9 A.M. Stead of
 Lat Byob 31° 29' Sd 70 Later part Irish gales from the Long in 176° 40' E.S.E. and cloudy so ends

Church Island ¹⁸⁴²
 Saturday Sept 3rd These 24 hours Comm. with a Irish gale from the Eastward and cloudy weather Ship under double Reef Topsails Steady of S.E. 75° S the Island 106 in sight at 5 P.M. Tuck sail at 11 P.M. were ship to the North at 7 A.M. set double Reef Topsails at 9 A.M. were ship to the S.E. Later part Irish gales and thick weather S.E.

Sunday Sept 4th These 24 hours Comm. with a Irish gale from the E.S.E. and hazy weather Ship under double Reef Sails Steady to the S.E. at 6 P.M. Tuck in sail for the night Middle part Irish gale at 6 P.M. set double Reef Topsails and Stead West 75° S at 9 A.M. Hazy hold up
 No work this day The fore sail and hold to the wind to the Eastward later part Hazy.

Monday Sept 5th These 24 hours Comm. with a Irish gale from the N.E. and thick Hazy weather Ship under double Reef Topsails heading to the East at 6 P.M. Tuck in sail for the night Middle part Calm and foggy at 6 A.M. made sail at 11 A.M. Stead Calm later part continued Calm so ends
 Lat Byob 31° 11' South Long in 176° 45'
