 Friday Nov 18 These 24 hours come with
 severe the light breeze from the S.W. & E.
 and foggy weather all the week
 employed in capturing Crabs
 been mending the mizen
 and so forth Capt. Ester went
 on board the *Rever of Longhacker*
 at 7 P.M. took in sail for the
 night Middle part light breeze
 at 8 AM made sail and began
 showing down oil later part fine
 weather so ended
 Lat. 39° 31' N
 Long. 160° 51' W

Saturday Nov 19 These 24 hours come with a light
 breeze from the S.W. and fine
 weather ship under all sail
 going S.W. all hands on
 deck showing our ship in sight
 at 7 P.M. took in sail for the
 night Middle part light breeze
 at 4 AM made sail at 5 AM
 foggy weather later part continued
 the same so ended
 Lat. 39° 56' N
 Long. 160° 56' W

Sunday Nov 20 These 24 hours come with breeze
 from the S.W. and thick haze
 weather ship under all sail
 going to the North Nothing
 in sight at 5 P.M. saw three
 whale boats and chased with
 our guns at 7 P.M. took in
 sail for the night at 4 AM
 made sail at 6 AM and in half
 hour saw three ships, sounder
 west of with North tones so ended
 Lat. 39° 24' N
 Long. 160° 27' W

Ship *Clark Ester Master 1842*
 Monday Nov 21 These 24 hours come with a light
 breeze from the S.W. and
 foggy weather ship under
 full top sails going to the S.W.
 our ship in sight at 7 P.M.
 took in sail for the night
 Middle part light breeze
 at 4 AM made sail saw several
 fish at 9 AM heard of boats
 later part fresh breeze from the
 W. & E. so ended

Tuesday Nov 22 These 24 hours come with a light
 breeze from the S.W. and
 cloudy weather ship under
 all sail going southward
 employed on ship duty at 7
 P.M. took in sail for the night
 Middle part heavy gale from the
 S.W. at 6 AM took in the
 top sail set the two mizens
 Lat. 39° 56' N Ship head N.E. saw fish what
 Long. 160° 51' W later part heavy gale so ended

Wednesday Nov 23 These 24 hours come with
 heavy gale from the S.W. and
 hazy weather ship lying
 low under coast of New
 England at 2 P.M. were ship to the
 North set the top sail at 7 took
 in sail for the night mizens
 part fresh gale at 4 AM set
 Lat. 39° 56' N full top sails stand south
 Long. 160° 56' W at 10 AM heard S.E. later part
 fresh gale so ended
