

Ship *Theresa* of Baltimore 1842
 Tuesday November 27th

These 24 hours come with a light breeze from the S.W. cloudy weather ship under all sail by the S. to the S.E. at 2 P.M. saw one whale. Load three boats Chained with cut lines at 4 P.M. Tacked ship to the westward under the mainstaysail and boom another at 7 P.M. Tuck in sail for the night Middle Port light breeze. At 4 A.M. made all sail Tacked ship to the south at 9 A.M. spoke the ship *Theresa* of Baltimore with some barrels of oil and saw Whales along side later part fine weather so ends

These 24 hours come with a light breeze from the S.W. cloudy weather ship under all sail by the wind to the south at 7 P.M. Tuck in the night at 4 A.M. made all sail Stead South later part fine breeze hazy weather so ends

These 24 hours come with a light breeze from the S.W. and hazy weather ship under all sail steering south at 2 P.M. Steered S.W. all the watch employed mending the mainstaysail. Middle Port and later part fine weather so ends

 Tuesday December 2nd

These 24 hours come with a fresh wind from the S.W. and hazy weather ship under all sail steering S.W. at one P.M. Tuck in the mainstaysail and boom at 7 P.M. Tuck in sail for the night Middle Port fine weather. At 4 A.M. set double reef topsails later part foggy so ends

No obs this day
 Saturday Dec the 3rd

These 24 hours come with a light breeze from the S.W. and thick weather at one P.M. saw one whale. Load three boats West Boat struck down. Tied with the iron at 2 P.M. Tuck the whale to the ship and began cutting at 6 P.M. finished Tuck in sail. Saw the right Middle Port foggy weather. At 6 A.M. began boiling later part thick foggy weather so ends

No obs this day
 Sunday Dec the 4th

These 24 hours come with a fresh gale from the S.W. and thick weather ship lying under close reef mainstaysail and boom heading to the eastward all the watch employed on hoglines. Middle Port thick foggy weather. At 5 A.M. finished boiling and steered of south at 8 A.M. set close reef topsails later part fresh gale from the westward
