 These 24 hours Comm. with fresh  
 Gale from the South and  
 Hailing Ship Under full Sail  
 Topsails at 2 P.M. wind holding  
 to the S.E. at 4 P.M. let one Reef  
 Out the Topsails Ship Storing  
 S.W. 1/2 S. Middle part Main  
 All Sail at 6 A.M. Hailing at  
 10 A.M. wind Enriving Tuck in  
 the Topgallant Sail Later part  
 Irish gales so Ends

Friday  
 On the 8  
 These 24 hours Comm. with  
 fresh gales from the S.E. and  
 Hailing Ship Under all Sail  
 Depart at 4 P.M. Tuck in  
 the Topsails Tuck the gill and  
 Shanker Middle part Irish wind  
 and Hailing at 7 A.M. Tuck in gill  
 and Main sail at 8 A.M. close  
 kept the Topsails later part heavy  
 Gale from the S.E. so Ends

Saturday  
 On the 9  
 These 24 hours Comm. with a  
 fresh gale from the S.E. and  
 thick weather Ship Under close  
 Reef Topsails at one P.M. more  
 Moderate let the gill and Main  
 sail let one Reef out the Topsails  
 All the watch employed on Ship's  
 duty Middle part light breeze  
 From the at 5 A.M. made all sail  
 at 8 A.M. wind S.W. Later part  
 light breeze and pleasant so Ends

 On the 10  
 These 24 hours Comm. with a fine  
 breeze from the S.W. and pleasant  
 Ship Under all Sail all the  
 Watch employed on Ship's duty  
 Ship Storing S.W. Middle part  
 light breeze at 3 A.M. let the  
 Storing sails Later part Squally  
 Tuck in the Storing sails so Ends

Monday  
 On the 11  
 These 24 hours Comm. with a fresh  
 Wind from the S.W. and Hailing  
 at 2 P.M. Pleasant let the Storing  
 sails Ship Storing S.W. Middle  
 part light breeze at 6 A.M. light  
 shower of Rain Later part Calm  
 Long 46.39 W. the pleasant weather so Ends

Tuesday  
 On the 12  
 These 24 hours Comm. with light  
 Breezes and Variable Ship Under all  
 Sail on the wind to the East at  
 P.M. Tackled Ship to the westward  
 Middle part Calm Later part  
 Continued the same so Ends

Wednesday  
 On the 13  
 These 24 hours Comm. with a calm  
 Ship Under all Sail all the  
 Watch employed on Ship's duty  
 at 4 P.M. on Board the Topsails  
 and Bent a few on Middle part  
 Light breeze from the Eastward  
 at 6 A.M. wind Enriving  
 Later part fresh Breeze and  
 Parting Clouds so Ends
