

Ship *Morena of Father's 1842*
 Saturday Feb the 3
 These 24 hours Com. with a fine
 breeze from the S.W. and fine
 weather ship under all sail
 Steering S.W. by W. running for Salango
 At 6 P.M. came to anchor in
 Salango in 10 fathoms of water.
 With the best Bower anchor
 With 50 fathoms of chain paid
 The sails Middle part light breeze
 At 7 A.M. Com. working later part
 Irish breeze So ends

Sunday Feb the 4
 These 24 hours Com. with a light
 breeze from the S.W. and fine
 weather ship lying at Salango
 All hands employed on working
 one watch on liberty in the
 forenoon and one watch on shore
 In the afternoon later part heavy
 surf on the shore So ends

Monday Feb the 5
 These 24 hours Com. with a light
 breeze from the S.W. and fine
 weather ship lying at Salango all
 hands employed on working and
 watering Middle and later part
 fine pleasant weather So ends

Tuesday Feb the 6
 These day Com. with a light
 breeze from the South and fine
 weather ship lying at Salango
 All hands employed on working
 Middle part fine weather
 later part continued the same

Wednesday Feb the 7
 These day Com. with a light breeze
 from the South at 9 A.M. got
 under way and went to sea at
 11 A.M. Stead the anchors and
 on Bent the chains and Stead
 Then below later part pleasant
 So ends this day By Seal & Count

Thursday Feb the 8
 These 24 hours Com. with a light
 breeze from the South and fine
 weather ship under all sail
 Steering S.W. by W. all the watch
 employed on ship's duty the
 land in sight Middle part
 light breeze at 3 A.M. fresh breeze
 from the S.W. later part Pleasant
 weather So ends
 Lat 00° 33' S
 Long 82° 57' W

Friday Feb the 9
 These 24 hours Com. with a light
 breeze from the S.W. and fine
 weather ship under all sail
 Steering to the westward all the
 watch employed turning in the
 forenoon Middle part light breeze
 At 5 A.M. wind held to the S.W.
 later part light breeze and pleasant
 weather So ends
 Lat 00° 34' S
 Long 83° 57' W

Saturday Feb the 10
 These 24 hours Com. with a light
 breeze from the S.W. and pleasant
 ship under all sail on the wind
 to the westward all the watch employed
 on ship's duty Middle part light
 breeze from the South later part
 light showers of rain So ends
 Lat 00° 37' S
 Long 85° 30' W
