 weather ship under all sail  
 Steering South Middle part calm

Lat 30° 14' 30" Later part continued the same  
 Long 176° 16' 00" to end

Wednesday  
 April 10<sup>th</sup> There 24 hours calm with calm  
 and fine weather ship under all  
 sail at 2 PM light breeze from the  
 North at 4 PM speak the ship  
 Graduate of New Bedford with 1500 of  
 oil Middle part calm at 6 AM  
 slight breeze from the same at 10

Lat 30° 36' 30" AM took in the Topgallant sails  
 Long 177° 30' 00" Double Reef the Main Mizen Topsails  
 Later part Irish gales to end

Thursday  
 April 11<sup>th</sup> There 24 hours calm with fish  
 gales from the NNE and cloudy  
 weather at 4 PM Double Reef the  
 Main Topsail ship hede 30° 00'

 April 14<sup>th</sup> There 24 hours calm with fine  
 breeze from the South and cloudy  
 weather ship under all sail

Lat 35° 46' 30" Steering N 1/2 E at 2 PM saw high  
 Long 176° 32' 00" light breeze from the  
 South at 4 PM speak the ship  
 Graduate of New Bedford with 1500 of  
 oil Middle part calm at 6 AM  
 slight breeze from the same at 10  
 Lat 35° 46' 30" AM took in the Topgallant sails  
 Long 177° 30' 00" Double Reef the Main Mizen Topsails  
 Later part Irish gales to end

Monday  
 April 15<sup>th</sup> There 24 hours calm with fine  
 breeze from the South and sunny  
 weather ship under all sail

Lat 37° 19' 30" Steering to the N 1/2 E at 6 PM shorten  
 Long 176° 53' 00" sail for the night and stand 30°  
 at 8 PM and foggy later part fog

 breeze from the S 1/2 E and thick hazy  
 weather ship under all  
 Topsails Steering N 1/2 E

Lat 38° 19' 30" Middle Part Irish breeze at 6  
 Long 176° 53' 00" AM set Cloast Reef Topsails  
 at 9 AM took in the Topsails  
 at 11 AM took in the Iron sail  
 and how two head to the N 1/2 E  
 Later part Irish gales and hazy
