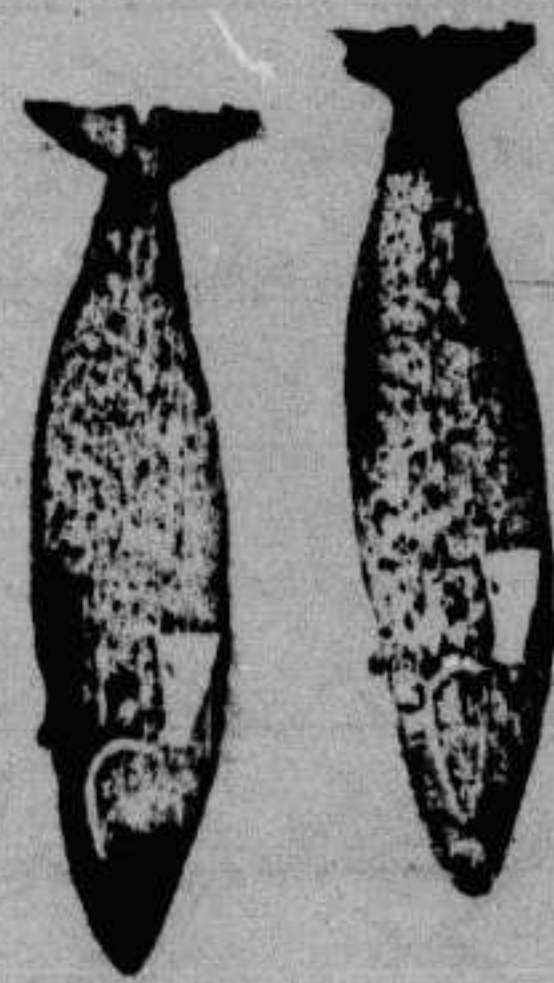


Ship *Providence of Fall River 1844*
 With the Boe of Storm of Cutting
 In a Night whale Middle Part
 Calm at 4 AM sail all sail
 At 9 AM saw one whale head
 With out Cues. So Ends
 Wednesday
 May the 29
 These 24 hours calm with Irish
 from the S.E. and thick weather
 Ship Under all sail 8 PM saw
 one whale head Chaud with out
 Cues at 7 PM struck the same
 Whale gut stove lost the line at
 Truck in sail head 18 C Middle
 Part Irish breeze at 4 AM made
 All sail at 6 AM saw five whale
 head west Boat struck and broad
 Later part Irish gales Suble Reef the
 Sopsails So C
 Saturday
 May the 30
 These 24 hours Calm with Irish
 gales from the East Ship heaving
 South Employed mending the
 larboard Boat At 5 PM Cleast
 Reef the maintop sail at 7 PM
 Truck in the fore sail chise
 Part heavy gale at 6 AM wore
 Ship to the S.E. later part
 Thick weather So Ends
 No 6 to
 Friday
 May 31
 These 24 hours Calm with fish
 gale from the Eastward and heavy
 Sea turning Ship head S.W.E
 at 4 PM wore moust at 6 PM
 wore Ship to S.E. Middle part

At 5 AM set Suble Reef Tapsails
 Stead East at 11 AM wore Ship
 Long 163.00 C
 To the S.W. with fog So Ends
 Saturday
 June 1st



Sunday
 June 2nd

The most part of these 24 hours
 Calm with fish gales from the
 North and heavy weather Ship
 Under Suble Reef Tapsails heading
 N.W. B.W. Middle Part moust at
 5 AM made sail head three boats struck
 And killed two whale at 12 meridian
 Truck them long side gut dinner gut
 Ready for cutting So Ends

These 24 hours Calm with fish breeze
 from the Eastward All hands
 Employed on cutting at 7 PM finished
 one whale at 6 PM set the wacke clearing
 ing the deck Ready for Boiling
 Middle Part Fine weather Ship head
 N.W. B.W. at 6 AM began cutting at
 At 12 meridian finished cutting So Ends

Monday
 June the 3rd
 These 24 hours Calm with Breeze
 from the S.W. and thick weather
 All hands Employed on Boiling Ship
 Head S.E. Middle part thick weather
 At 7 AM set Fore and Mizzen Tapsails
 Saw whale later part light breeze and
 fog one sail in sight So Ends
 Saturday
 June 4th
 Long 163.00 C
