

No Obs. Middle part strong breeze and cloudy -
Latter part fresh gale from the same
ship under close reefed M. Topsail - so ends -

Friday
June 28th These 24 hours commences with a fresh
gale from the N.E. and cloudy lying
too under close reefed M. Topsail - Middle
Lat. 51° 52' part more moderate. Latter part light
Long. 160° 18' breeze ship under all sail at 4 A.M. commenced
boiling on the same Whale - and dried some bones
saw plenty of fin backs - so ends -

Saturday
June 29th These 24 hours commences with a light breeze
from the West steering N. by W. and clear
weather - Middle part foggy Latter part light
Lat. 53° 18' breeze from the South and clear at 4 A.M.
Long. 160° 24' finished boiling - at 8 saw Land, bearing N.
West distance about 70 Miles - so ends -

Sunday
June 30th These 24 hours commences with a light breeze
from the South and clear ship under all
sail steering N. East at 4 P.M. saw a Right
No Obs. whale - calf. Middle part foggy. Latter part
the same steering N. by E. so ends -

Monday
July 1st These 24 hours comm: with a moderate breeze
from the S.W. and thick fog running N. by E.
Lat. 53° 07' Middle and Latter parts the same so ends -

Tuesday
July 2nd These 24 hours comm: with fresh breeze from the
S.W. and a thick fog ship running N.E. by W.
Lat. 52° 48' at 4 past 12 commenced stowing down at 4 finish
shed. Middle and Latter parts thick fog lying
so ends this day -

Wednesday
July 3rd These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze
from S.W. and thick fog ship lying to on the
Starboard tacks - Middle and Latter parts
Lat. 53° 43' clear weather at 2 past 3 A.M. made all
Long. 161° 35' sail and steering W. N. W. at 10 Saw Land
a head so ends -

Thursday
July 4th These 24 hours comm: with a light breeze
from the S.W. and clear weather - standing
off shore saw plenty of Humpbacks - Middle
Lat. 53° 53' and Latter part the same at 10 A.M. saw
Long. 161° 45' 3 large Whales. Lowered the boats without success

Friday
July 5th These 24 hours comm: with a light breeze from
the S.W. and clear weather at 4 P.M.
Lowered without success - Middle and Latter
Lat. 53° 54' parts fresh breeze from the same at 4 A.M.
Long. 161° 50' spoke the Ship William Hamblin of New Bedford
22 Months out 2800 at 8 Saw Whales
and lowered without success - so ends -

Saturday
July 6th These 24 hours comm: with a fresh breeze
from S.W. at 2 P.M. saw Whales Lowered
the boats struck, killed and sunk him - got
Lat. 54° 10' one boat stowed - Middle and Latter parts
Long. 162° 48' light breeze from the same - so ends -

Sunday
July 7th These 24 hours comm: with a light breeze from
the West at 3 P.M. Saw Whales and lowered
without success - at 7 P.M. spoke the ship Philip
Lat. 54° 23' Tabb of Warren 1609 a Whale along side. Middle
Long. 163° 38' and Latter part Strong wind increasing to a
gale saw several Whales - so ends -
