Tuesday July 9th These 24 hours comm: with light breeze from S.W. and rain. at 3 P.M. made sum sail at 6 foggy took them in view. Middle and Latter parts foggy weather - so ends -

Wednesday July 10th These 24 hours comm: with a light breeze from the North and thick fog - Middle part the same. Latter part sum clair weather saw several sails - so ends
Lat. 54° 48'

Thursday July 11th These 24 hours comm: with light breeze from the West and sum fog spoke the ships Roman 3800 - French Barque Fanny 1700 - Danish ship Neptun 8 Whales - Middle and Latter part wind S.W. and thick fog, ship under all sail heading Southward - so ends

Friday July 12th These 24 hours comm: with fresh breeze from S.W. ship under all sail on the Starboard, talked saw one Whale in the fog - at Sun set took in sail - Middle part the same. Latter part clair weather and a light breeze at 7 saw Whales lowered the Boats struck and killed one at 3 took him along side and commenced gutting

Saturday July 13th These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the S.W. and clair weather at 5 P.M. finished cutting in and comm: Boiling -

Sunday July 14th These 24 hours commences with a light wind from the North and clair weather. Middle and Latter parts calm - so ends -

Monday July 15th These 24 hours comm: with a light breeze from the West and clair weather at 3 P.M. spoke the ship Connecticut of New London 1400 - at 4 finished boiling Middle part sum fog Latter part fresh wind from S.S.W. stowed down sum oil at 11 A.M. Saw 3 Whales lowered the boats and found, came on thick fog and cut from them - so ends

Tuesday July 16th These 24 hours comm: with fresh breeze from S.W. and cloudy weather standing to the South and Eastward. Middle and Latter parts fresh breeze from the S.E. steering W. by S. at 11 Saw 3 Whales, lowered the boats without success - so ends -

Wednesday July 17th These 24 hours a fresh gale from the S.E. and rainy weather spoke the ship Lionidas of Bristol with all her boats stowed 81000 barrels of oil Middle part more moderate Latter part fresh breeze from the same and heavy weather stowed down the remainder of the oil - so ends

Thursday July 18th These 24 hours a fresh breeze from the S.E. and heavy weather - Saw 5 Whales and lowered the Boats twice without success - Middle and Latter part the same wind saw 2 Whales lowered without
