July 29th
Lat. 53° 27'

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the West and clear weather saw several Whales and chased them without success. 2 sails in sight - Middle and Latter parts calm. saw 2 Whales and chased them, but could not get fast, going very quick so ends -

Tuesday
July 30th
Lat. 53° 37'

These 24 hours comm. with a pleasant breeze from the West and sun fog. saw several Whales going quick to windward - Middle part light breeze and rainy. Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W. and a heavy swell on. saw 2 Whales going to windward - so ends -

Wednesday
July 31st
Lat. 53° 24'
Long. 163° 18'

These 24 hours comm. with a light breeze from the N.W. and clear weather spoke the Barque Bayard of Greenport with 1000 middle part the same. Latter part a light breeze and Calms at 8 a.m. saw Whales lowered the boats struck one so ends -

Thursday
Aug 1st

These 24 hours comm. with light breeze from the North at 4 P.M. took the Whale along side and commenced cutting - at 1/2 past 8 lashed down for the night - middle part the same. Latter part fresh breeze from South and thick fog, at 4 a.m. commenced cutting again, at 11 finished cutting in sound

Friday
Aug 2nd

These 24 hours commences with a thick fog and wind from the South at meridians commenced sailing - Middle part thick weather wind hale to the Eastward Latter part thick foggy so ends

Ship *Provena* of *Palluice* 1844
Saturday
August 3rd
No Ob to day

These 24 hours comm. with light breeze from the East. Made our thick weather Ship under short sail all hands employed on boiling nothing in sight Middle part fog at 11 A.M. made sail wore Ship to the No. Latter part fair weather so ends

Sunday
August 4th
Lat. 52° 35'
Long. 165° 56'

These 24 hours comm. with light breeze from the S.W. and fair weather Ship under full sail 12 P.M. saw whales lower three boats with out success at 6 P.M. sunk in sail at 10 P.M. finished boiling Middle part thick weather at 5 P.M. began stirring down the main back Way Latter part saw several whale Maie sail so ends

Monday
August 5th
No Ob to day

These 24 hours comm. with a fine breeze from the S.W. and pleasant weather Ship under all sail stirring. No one sail in sight at 7 P.M. Shorten sail for the night Middle part foggy at 5 o'clock began stirring down Latter part brisk gale from the Eastward

Tuesday
August 6th

These 24 hours comm. with fresh gale from the Eastward and foggy. Ship lying under Coast Reef main topmast one ship in sight Middle part brisk gale and thick weather Latter part continued the same so ends
