 Thursday Aug 22 There 24 hours calm with fresh
 Gale from the S.E. and fair
 Weather Ship under Close Reef
 Main top sail heading S.W. by S.
 At sundown saw the land bearing
 S.W. Middle Part light breeze from
 the E.S.E. At 5 AM made all sail
 Later part Calm 9 ships in sight
 Lat 52.56.8 Long 166.26.8

Friday Aug 23 There 24 hours calm with light air
 and calm about the fore said top sail
 The main top galant sail at 7 PM
 Shorten sail for the night at 8 PM
 Spoke the ship *Indiant* Middle
 Part light breeze at 5 AM made
 all sail Stead 10. 8 PM at 11 AM
 Double Reef the top sails later part
 fresh gale from the south land
 126 in sight 16 miles

Saturday Aug 24 There 24 hours calm with fresh
 Gale from the south and fair
 Weather Ship under Double Reef
 Top sails heading in to the land
 At one PM saw whale boat three
 boats Starboard boat struck
 and broad at 7 PM Shorten sail
 At 5 AM made all sail at 9 AM saw
 Whale boat with out crew S.E.

Sunday Aug 25 There 24 hours begins with light
 Breeze from the south and cloudy
 Weather saw several fine backs
 one ship in sight to the south

 At 7 PM Tack in sail for
 the night Middle part fresh
 Gale At 6 AM Close Reef the
 Main top sail Tack in the fore
 sail set the spinnaker later part
 heavy gale from the E.S.E. and
 Mairing two ships in sight 16 miles
 No Dr to Day

Monday Aug 26 There 24 hours calm with heavy
 Gale from the Eastward and
 Mairing weather Ship under
 Close Reef Main top sail and
 spinnaker heading S.E. Middle
 Part wind hold to the south were
 ship at 5 AM light breeze and
 heavy swell set double Reef top sail
 Later part light breeze and variable
 with fog 16 miles three ships in sight
 Lat 53.26.8 Long 166.26.8

Tuesday Aug 27 There 24 hours calm with light
 breezes and variable with fog Ship
 under double Reef top sail heading
 to the S.E. each employed on their
 ding the boat two ships in sight
 At 7 PM Tack in sail for the
 night At 5 AM set double Reef
 top sail and gill later part fresh
 breeze Stead E.S.E. 16 miles
 Lat 52.53.8 Long 166.26.8

Wednesday Aug 28 There 24 hours calm with fresh
 breeze from S.E. and cloudy weather
 Ship under double Reef top sail
 Steering E.S.E. one ship in sight
 to the south Steering to the westward
