weather all sail set. Steering S.W.
Bent the fore staysail.

Wednesday Jan 3rd

Moderate wind from S by E. all sail
set Steering SW by W. at 4 P.M.
the wind died away.

Long 56-44 W.

Thursday Jan 4th

Light wind from NW. all sail
set. Steering S by E. weather fair.

Lat 44-02 S.

Long 57-03 W.

Friday Jan 5th

Fresh breeze from NW. all
sail Steering S by E.
at 3 P.M. had a rain squall
and the wind died away.

Saturday Jan 6th



Saw sperm whales this
morning. Toward 3 boats at
9 A.M. struck. killed 9. 5 A.M.
hooked on at 2.30 P.M. finished
cutting at 8 P.M.

Sunday Jan 7th

Commenced boiling at 4 A.M.
this morning. finished the
head at 6 P.M. Lat 47-05 S.

Long 56-30 W.

Monday Jan 8th

These 24 hours employed in
boiling. light breeze from S.W.

Lat 46-26 S.

Long 56-13 W.

Tuesday Jan 9th

These 24 hours employed boiling
finished at 4 P.M. a strong breeze from
N.W.

Lat 46-42 S.

Long 57-24 W.

Wednesday Jan 10th

The day employed cooping
the oil and stowing down. Light breeze
from S.S.W. Steering S.W. Lat 46-50 S.

Long 56-40 W.

Thursday Jan 11th

First part calm latter part
light breeze from NW. all sail set
steering S.W. Lat 47-05 S.

Long 57-16 W.
