Friday Jan 12th

Strong breeze from N.W. all sail
set steering S.W. sent down the fore
royal yard. Lat 48-43 S.

Long 61-04 W.

Saturday Jan 13th

Strong wind from North. all
sail set steering S.W. took the
bow boat in on deck and sent down the
main royal yard. Lat 50-50 S.

Long 64-44 W.

Sunday Jan 14th

Strong wind from west. took in
the top gallant sails and ~~reduced~~ the top sails
steering S.E. by E. Lat 52-26 S.

Long 64-23 W.

Monday Jan 15th

Commences with strong wind
from west the watch busy in making
and taking in sail. at 4 A.M. saw
Staten Land bearing S by E. at 3 p
miles distant at 4 P.M. past Cape St
John 6 miles distant. at 7 P.M. Cape
St John was bearing S by E.

Long 62-40 W.

Tuesday Jan 16th

Cloudy with strong breeze from
west. all sail set steering S by E. There
was a sail in sight this morning.

Lat 56-10 S.

Long 66-00 W.

Off Cape Horn

Wednesday Jan 17th

Begins with strong wind
from S.E.W. Ship heading to the S.E.
by the wind. at 3 P.M. the wind
hauled to the N.E. with a heavy
sea. We saw Cape Horn this morning
at 35 miles distant bearing N.N.W.

Thursday Jan 18th

Light wind from S.W.
all sail set. steering full and by the
wind. this morning we caught two
albatross, made a sea pie of them
they were very good, much better than
I expected.

Lat 57-39 S.

Long 67-03 W.

Friday Jan 19th

Light breeze from S.W. all
sail set steering by the wind.
We exchanged signals with a
French ship this afternoon.

Lat 57-16 S.

Long 68-13 W.

Saturday Jan 20th

Begins with light air
from N.E.W. and fine weather all sail
set steering to the westward by the
wind. at 3 P.M. saw the Diego
Ramirez bearing N.E. by N. one sail
in sight.

Lat 57-07 S.

Long 69-10 W.
