

Thursday May 3rd

First part strong wind at N.W.
ten sails in sight. Middle & latter part strong
breeze and two boats in the ice to look for
whales but did not see any. 6 sails in sight.
No Observation.

Friday June 1st 1866

First part strong breeze at N.W.
spoke the bark Roscol. Capt Macomber saw
two ships sailing. On the 29th ult.
Latter part strong breeze. worked the ship
through the ice as far as we could and
have 13 sails in sight.
No Observation.

Saturday June 2nd

First part strong breeze at
N. with thick fog bent the main stay.
sail. Latter part strong breeze. 22 sails in
sight.
No Observation.

Sunday June 3rd

Strong breeze at N.B.E. Spoke
the ship Ocean & bark Roscol. Middle & latter
part strong breeze. 23 sails in sight.
Lat 62. 37
Long 179. 31.

Monday June 4th

Strong breeze from N.B.E. to N.B.W.
saw a tow head. Middle & latter light breeze
at N.W. saw 3 towheads. Toward two
boats but could not get near them.
Lat 62. 37.
Long 180. 00.

Tuesday June 5th

First part light airs and calms
middle light breeze and thick fog at S.S.W.
Latter part light breeze and fine weather.

Wednesday June 6th

Light breeze at S.E. spoke the
bark Camillia Capt Thomas has his wife with
him. At 8 pm saw a towhead toward
three boats but without success. middle
& latter part thick fog. No Observation.

Thursday June 7th

First part light breeze and
thick fog at N.W. middle & latter part light
breeze and thick fog. No Observation.

Friday June 8th

First part light breeze and
fine weather at N. all sail set steering
S.E. spoke the ship Ocean Capt
Barber saw two towheads to day. 14
sails in sight. No Observation.

Saturday June 9th

First part light breeze and fine
weather at N. middle part light airs and clear.
at 2 o'clock this morning saw towheads
toward 4 boats but the ice was so heavy
we could not get near them. latter part
light breeze at S.E. 20 sails in sight, two
of them sailing. Lat 63. 11.
Long 178. 33.
